#### From the Deacon's Desk:

"He was totally disconnected from the Web, but totally in touch with the incredible web of life around him. I wonder if there's a lesson here?" A quote taken from Thomas Friedman's (New York columnist) article titled, "The Age of Interruption". He took a trip into the Peruvian Amazon rain for-

est. He spoke of the "violence of the rain forest as each species struggled for life, 'but with an identifiable purpose; plants and animals demarcating and protecting territory for the survival of their species.' The violence that humans display seems to be without purpose. Species that behave like humans in the rain forest become extinct." He then switched gears and spoke of multitasking our way through the day, "continuously devoting only partial attention to each act or person you encounter". He cited Linda Stone's (former Microsoft exec.) label: "Continuous partial attention." He says as our attention span shrinks this is likened to a potential diagnosis of Attention Deficit Disorder. The Peruvian guide, he noted, had no A.D.D. and heard every chirp, whistle, and crackle and could identify every creature there. He was "totally disconnected from the 'web'". Is there a lesson here? You bet!

## **Small Faith Communities:**

Scripture focus: Both the first reading and the Gospel today tell stories of God feeding hungry people through the words and works of prophets. For the next five Sundays, we will hear the Bread of Life teaching from John's Gospel. For John, all of Jesus' acts are "signs" - sacraments - that point to a deeper reality. It is clear that the people do not appreciate the deeper meaning of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. The reaction of the crowd showed that they thought wrongly that Jesus was the triumphant and political Messiah. So Jesus goes "back to the mountains alone." The people had indeed misread the sign.

Life focus \* Relate a time when you were so engrossed in something important that you forgot to eat. \* Describe a time when you were surprised that your limited resources were sufficient. \* Relate a time when your prayers were answered on God's terms rather than your own. \* Share an experience in the recent past in which you recognized a definite sign of the Lord working in your life. \* Describe a time when you experienced abundance in your life. \* When have you shared your small amount with another? How did this make a difference in the person's life and/or in yours? \* Relate a time in your life when you were refreshed by someone. \* When did you get so caught up in the physical needs - just making a living - that there was no time & energy for anything else?

## **Quote from Tradition**

God beholds, as from a mountain - that is, from his high and divinely worthy foreknowledge - those who by good faith and zeal seek him, according to what was said by Paul, For those whom he foreknew and predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, he also called. Christ, then, lifts up his eyes, showing that those who love him are worthy of the divine gaze, just as it was said in blessing to Israel, The Lord let his face shine upon you & give you peace. But his grace towards those that honor him does not stop in merely looking upon them; the blessed Evangelist adds that the Lord was not unmindful of the multitudes, but well prepared for their food and refreshment. So, you may understand here again what was said in Proverbs, The Lord does not permit the just to hunger. For he sets himself before them, as bread from heaven, and will nourish the souls of those that fear him; and he prepares everything needed for their sustenance, as he says in the Psalms, You have prepared their food, for such is your providence. And Christ himself says somewhere, Amen, amen, I say to you, he who comes to me will never hunger. For, as we said before, he will give food from heaven, and will richly bestow the manifold grace of the Spirit. What is more, he prepares to give food to those who come to him without even waiting for them to ask.
