The readings of today's celebration remind us who has ultimate dominion over the earth: "All peoples, nations, and languages serve (the Son of man)." Greater than any human power or sovereignty is the kingdom of Christ. It is a reminder to us of who is ultimately in charge of our lives.

From the Deacon's Desk:



What's a deacon anyway? Just after being ordained 5 years ago, I was walking across the school yard and saw a young student. I said "Hi" and he greeted me and said, "You're the new deacon." I asked his name. Then I asked if he

knew what a deacon was. He said, "My mom says a deacon is a 'grunt'!!" I took that as a compliment since I thought of the term in the military sense, i.e. a grunt is an infantryman, a person who is in the front line of battle, the foot soldier. As in Acts 6:1-7: The disciples grew in number and some widows were being neglected in the daily distribution of food. The disciples selected 7 men filled with faith and the Holy Spirit and presented them to the apostles who prayed over them and laid hands upon them. They became the foot soldiers for the apostles.

Most of us over 50 years old only knew the diaconate as a step along the way to the priesthood. That is considered a "transitional deacon" - he is sort of "passing through" on the ordination journey. During Vatican II, the pope and bishops decided to restore the old order of permanent diaconate. I have to interject here that the word deacon is derived from the Greek diakonos which means "servant" and "helper", reference Philippians 1:1. The diaconate flourished for several centuries. St. Clement of Rome (96 A.D.) speaks of bishops and deacons as the "first fruits of the Apostles". Stephen was the first martyr and Philip the evangelist (Acts 21:8) was the host of Paul and Luke in Caesarea. Rome honored St. Lawrence (d.258) as deacon martyr. St. Ephrem (d. 373) was a deacon scholar. Deacon educator Alcuin (804) and Francis of Assisi (d. 1226) were admired universally as the model of poverty and simplicity. The "golden age" came to an end in the early fourth century in the Latin Church. Resentment of excessive diaconal power and influence threatened the original meaning of deacon as servant. The Council of Sardica declared that this order would become a transitional step to priesthood. For 16 centuries until Vatican II the diaconate remained dormant.

On the feast of St. Ephrem, Deacon, June 18, 1967, Pope Paul VI restored the Order of Deacon as a permanent ministry in the Latin Church. April 23, 1968, the American Bishops petitioned for the restoration of the diaconate in the United States. The petition was granted in August that year.

Small Faith Communities:

Scripture focus: The Gospel of Mark was written about a half-century after the Resurrection, so its stories of Jesus reflect both traditions about the life of Jesus and the traditions of the earliest Christian communities, who saw in the life of Jesus an inspiration for the hardships they faced in their own lives of faith.

The three accounts of the Transfiguration in the synoptic Gospels all depict Jesus in shining white, but each of the evangelists describes this with different words (although many translations don't reflect that). For Matthew his clothes were "white as light," for Luke "dazzling white," and here in Mark they were "dazzling ...as no fuller on earth could bleach them."

The narrative here has four basic parts: the Transfiguration with the apostles nearby, the appearance of Elijah and Moses and Peter's words, the voice from the cloud, and finally the descent and Jesus' command that they tell no one what took place.

Life focus * In what ways does Mark's account of the Transfiguration of Jesus highlight the brilliance and significance of Jesus? * How does Mark's Transfiguration account compare with Gospel passages about the appearances of the Risen Lord? What is the same, and what is different? * What does the identification of Jesus as the glorious Son of Man suggest about his role in the fullness of God's kingdom?

Quote from Tradition

Peter said. Let us make three tents. But the Lord shows them a dwelling not made with hands. There was ineffable light, and a voice. In order to show that he was speaking not simply of one of the three, but only of Christ, when the voice had finished speaking, Moses and Elijah had departed. For if it had spoken merely of any one of them, Christ would not have remained alone while the others departed. And what did this voice say? This is my beloved Son. If he is the Beloved, do not fear, Peter. You should now know of both his power and his majesty, and be confident of his resurrection; but since you do not know these things, then at least take courage from the voice of the Father. For if the Father is allpowerful, his Son is as well. So do not be afraid of dangers. But if this will not reassure you, then remember at least that he is the Father's Son, and his Beloved! For, he says, this is my beloved Son. If he is the Beloved, do not be afraid. Because no one casts off the one he loves. Do not be troubled then: however much you love him, you do not love him as much as his own Father does. Listen to him, he says. So, if he wills to be crucified, do not oppose him.
