### From the Pastor's Desk:



From the Deacon's Desk: Ministry of the *Word*: At the ordination, the Archbishop presents the deacon with the Book of the Gospels and imparts these words, *"Believe what you read, Teach what you believe, Practice what you* 

*teach.*" The deacon rightfully proclaims the Gospel at Mass, even if the *pope* himself is present!!

Deacons, like priests, are expected to pray the *"Liturgy* of the Hours" (sometimes referred to as the 'breviary' or 'Divine Office'), which is the official prayer of the Church. Through this prayer the deacon unites himself with the universal Church. The prayer consists of Old and New Testament readings, teachings of saints, excerpts from Councils and Doctors of the Church and includes intercessory (intentions) prayers.

Just as important as the deacon is his wife. They stay close to the Word of God by loving it, praying and studying and finally living it. The spiritual union of deacon and wife is crucial to the deacon's ministry of the Word. The deacon-couple then becomes a living gospel to the community and the Church. The deacon's wife is of utmost importance since it is she who supports and encourages her husband. The two are one spirit, one mind (Tina might question that one) and one flesh. The deacon-couple proclaims the Word to the secular world by their presence in their job and social life. They proclaim the gentleness and power of God's Word by their presence.

The ministry of the *Word* is a far-ranging one. It may include, besides proclaiming the Gospel, preaching, catechetical instruction and other forms of teaching, outreach to alienated Catholics and instruction to catechumens. The deacons' secular involvement equips them to bring questions and insights to bear on the Gospel and the clergy and can thus help lead the Church to a richer and deeper appreciation of the faith by which it lives.

If you stop and think about the above, it is not only the deacon-couple's responsibility but the responsibility of each and every one of us who by virtue of our Baptism are called to be "priest (to be holy), prophet (tell the truth) and king (help the less fortunate)".

**Scripture Focus:** The theme of "bread from heaven" is developed in many ways in this chapter of John's Gospel. Today's reading opens with the people murmuring. Since he was born in time, since the people knew his father and his mother, Jesus simply could not have come from heaven. Jesus does not meet their objection directly. He raises the discussion to a higher level. To understand him it is necessary to have faith. Only God can give faith. God holds out the gift to all who are open to receive it. Faith is acceptance of Jesus, and this faith in Jesus, eating the living bread, gives eternal life.

Life Focus: \* Relate an experience when you had a difficult time seeing Christ in someone you know well. \* Describe a time when you felt empty inside. What helped you through that empty period? \* Describe a time when you offered help to another and were rejected. How did you feel, and what did you do? \* How does believing in eternal life affect your daily living? \* Where does your life need nourishing? \* Relate an experience when you surprised yourself by doing something you ordinarily would be unable to do. \* Describe a time when someone fulfilled a hunger or a need in your life. \* Relate a time when you were misjudged or misinterpreted when you told the truth or did something good.

My flesh, he says, for the life of the world. The baptized come to know the Body of Christ, if they do not fail to be the Body of Christ. 
#### HOMELESS MINISTRY
