For Mark's community, which was mostly Gentile, the man's cure dramatized their hearing the Good News. God draws near to all, Jews & Gentiles. How did this experience make you feel? \* Recall an experience when you reached out to someone beyond your circle of friends.

#### **Quote from Tradition**

Glory be to him who received from us in order to give to us; so that through what is ours we could more abundantly receive from what is his! Yes, through that Mediator, mankind was able to receive life from its helper, as through a mediator it had received in the beginning death from its slayer. You are he who made for yourself a body as a servant, so that through it you might give to those who desire you, all that they desire. That power which may not be handled came down and clothed itself in the members of a body, so that it could be touched; so that the needy could draw near to him, so that in touching his humanity they could discern his Godhead. For that dumb man whom the Lord healed with the fingers of the body, discerned that he had approached his ears & touched his tongue, but more: by Christ's fingers that may be touched, the dumb man touched the Godhead, that may not be touched; when those fingers were loosing the string of his tongue, and opening the clogged doors of his ears. For the architect of the body and artificer of the flesh came to him, and with his gentle voice pierced without pain his thickened ears. And his mouth which was closed up, so that it could not give birth to a word, gave birth to praise to him who made its barrenness fruitful in the birth of words. He, then, who gave to Adam the ability to speak at once without any teaching, himself gave to the dumb the ability to speak easily tongues that are learned with difficulty.
