From the Pastor's Desk:


The question that Jesus asks his disciples in today's Gospel, "Who do you say that I am?" provoked Peter to make a confession of faith: "You are the Christ."

From the Deacon's Desk:

Here is a quote from anonymous, "When we take credit for what God has done, it's like an echo taking credit for producing its sound." Too often we think we are the ones who have become the "self-made man". I'm sure that God is

either chuckling or a little disheartened that He does not get credit. Many of us feel that "success" is measured by riches, maybe prestige or possessions. I have a friend who came up with what I feel is one of the best measures. He said, "If I can make someone breathe a little easier because of my existence, I consider that success." That, my friends, is a better measure of success than "he who has the most toys wins".

In the Gospel of last week, Jesus took the deaf-mute away from the crowd, away from the noise. He took him to have a personal encounter with the Messiah. Jesus calls us away from the crowd and away from the noise. He asks you to be quiet before Him. Let Him speak to you in the silence of your heart. It is an opportune time before and after Mass to spend time with Him, even time in silence with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament chapel. Silence out of respect for others and respect for our own need to listen to the Lord. Silence, in the guiet of our own home for 10 or 15 minutes after the kids are in bed or before the morning gets going. Let the Lord touch us. He might even open our eyes and our mouths to help us to stand up for our Catholic Christian beliefs and lifestyle that are in concert with the true will of the Lord, and that may allow us to consider the "social justice" issues that face us today. God presents us with the principle of "God's preferential love for the poor".

We pray this week in appreciation for those who work hard to produce the food that is on our tables, that they may get a fair living wage for the work they do and be provided with safe working conditions.

Scripture Focus: Today's Gospel is a key passage in Mark, a sort of hinge between the first and second parts of his Gospel. The first part is all about reactions to Jesus, looking forward to his final rejection in Jerusalem. In today's passage, we get the reaction of his own disciples, a crucial reaction. Peter, who appears to speak for all the disciples, gives a clear and direct reply. Jesus is the Messiah. But Jesus suspects that Peter's idea of a messiah is off the mark. Jesus predicts the Passion that will be the backbone of the next section. The emphasis will now be on the suffering Son of Man. Peter's idea of a popular political messiah gets a public reprimand from Jesus. This leads to the first of three instructions on discipleship. All share the fact that following Jesus will mean suffering with him through a life of selfless love.

Life Focus: * Describe an experience when you were willing to pay a price to follow the Lord. * Relate an experience that led you to a change of heart.

Quote from Tradition

I write to all the Churches, and impress on them all, that I shall willingly die for God, unless you hinder me. I beg you not to show an unseasonable goodwill towards me. Suffer me to become food for the wild beasts, through whose instrumentality it will be granted me to attain to God. I am the wheat of God, and am ground by the teeth of the wild beasts, that I may be found the pure bread of God. Rather, entice the wild beasts, that they may become my tomb, and may leave nothing of my body; so that when I have fallen asleep, I may not be found troublesome to any one. Then I shall be a true disciple of Jesus Christ, when the world shall not see so much as my body. Entreat the Lord for me, that by these instruments I may be found a sacrifice to God. All the pleasures of the world, and all the kingdoms of this earth, shall profit me nothing. It is better for me to die on behalf of Jesus Christ, than to reign over all the ends of the earth. What profit is there for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Him I seek, who died for us: him I desire, who rose again for our sake. This is the gain which is laid up for me. Pardon me, brethren: do not hinder me from living, do not wish to keep me in a state of death; and while I desire to belong to God, do not give me over to the world, Suffer me to obtain pure light: when I have gone there, I shall indeed be a man of God. Permit me to be an imitator of the passion of my God.
