From the Pastor's Desk:

I. The Shema is considered the most important text in Judaism. "Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone!" expresses both the unity of God and exclusive fidelity to God. It is a command to the people to be faithful to God. These verses from Deuteronomy are quoted

by Jesus in today's Gospel when he responds to the question of which is the greatest commandment. He adds to it a second commandment which comes from Leviticus 19:18: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Love of God and love of neighbor are not just nice words to engrave on a plaque or hang on a wall. (Although it's interesting that you don't hear of many Christians trying to get these two commandments posted in local courthouses.)

These commandments are to be engraved on our hearts and lived in our lives!

II. This weekend we acknowledge the importance of Fr. Harold Ford to our parish. Fr. Ford was ordained a priest in 1949 and has served the church in exemplary fashion ever since. His last parish before retiring to St. Joseph was All Souls in Alhambra. Fr. Ford arrived here at St. Joseph in 1989 and has spent the last 17 years helping out in our parish. Fr. Ford usually celebrates the 5:00 pm vigil Mass and always the 7:30 am Sunday Mass. As many a new altar server can attest, Fr. Ford's kindness and understanding has eased their anxieties. His thought provoking homilies have become a trademark of his Masses. This together with the Confessions that Fr. Ford hears provides a valuable ministry to our parish. We should all be extremely grateful to our octogenarian priest for all the help that he has given to the parish during his 17 years here.

Quote from Tradition

The scribe's answer seems to agree with the Lord's words, for he too proclaims the innermost love of one God, and professes the love of neighbor to be as real as the love of self, placing love of God and neighbor above all burnt offerings and sacrifices. But what follows? When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, you are not far from the kingdom of God. What is the meaning of such moderate praise? Believe in one God; love him with all your soul, all your strength, and all your heart, and love your neighbor as yourself; if this is the faith which makes one perfect for the kingdom of God, why is the scribe not already within, instead of not far? Elsewhere the Lord grants the kingdom to those who clothe the naked, feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, and visit the sick and the prisoner. Their possession is complete, their inheritance of the kingdom Is secured. But was this man's confession short of theirs? His ideal of duty raises love of neighbor to the level of love of self; what more did he lack for perfection? But the scribe was barred from perfection, because he did not know the mystery which had been accomplished. The Lord praised him for his profession of faith and he heard that he was not far from the kingdom, but he was not put in actual possession of the blessed of the blessed hope.... His own profession of the law is a reproach to him that the mystery of the law has escaped him; he does not know Christ the Lord, the Son of God, to be included in the confession of the one God, which according to the law seemed to leave no room for the Son of God in the mystery of one Lord.

<u>Proposition 85</u> - On November 7, the voters of California will have an opportunity to correct a present threat to family life and parental authority. Cardinal Mahony and the California Conference of Catholic bishops are asking for support of **Proposition 85**, the Parents' Right to Know and Child Protection Initiative. A "YES" vote on Proposition 85 will require parents to be notified 48 hours before a planned abortion on a minor.

Quote from U.S. Bishops - "We encourage all citizens, particularly Catholics, to embrace their citizenship not merely as a duty and privilege, but as an opportunity meaningfully to participate in building the culture of life. Every voice matters in the public forum. Every vote counts. Every act of responsible citizenship is an exercise of significant individual power. We must exercise that power in ways that defend human life, especially those of God's children who are unborn, disabled or otherwise vulnerable. We get the public officials we deserve. Their virtue, or lack thereof, is a judgment not only on them, but on us. Because of this, we urge our fellow citizens to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign rhetoric critically, and to choose their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest."

From the Question/Suggestion Box:

Church - School financial Arrangements - The school and the church form a single entity called the Parish. The two are inextricable related. The church subsidizes the school with a monthly stipend that helps with the day-to-day operation of the school. The school's administration wisely uses such money for irregular expenditures. The school uses standard business practices to keep expenditures to a minimum.

Mass Intentions - Very few parishes now include the names of the people requesting a Mass for their intentions. In an effort to save space in the bulletin, our Parish is also omitting such names. However, the people who request the Mass know when it will be celebrated.

- 4. How much do I give to the parish on a weekly basis? (If you give monthly or quarterly, calculate your weekly commitment to put it in perspective.)
- 5. Is it too much, too little or just right?
- 6. If I am not at the parish for one or more Sundays, do I make up the amount that I have not given?
- 7. How much will I give each week during the coming year?


