From the Deacon's Desk: I can't say leftovers from my last homily. So,

this is the homily that never was:

A grieving widow was discussing her late husband with a friend: "My Albert was such a good man, and I miss him so. He provided well for me

with that \$50,000 insurance policy - but I'd give a \$1,000 of it just to have him back." Just like the disciples, she failed to appreciate the difference between real and apparent sacrifice. Real sacrifice is internal. The radical message of today's (11-12) readings is that we must place our TRUST and confidence in God rather than material possessions. This is hard because it requires us to practice that forgotten virtue of HUMILITY. Only a humble person sees where he or she stands before God. Only a humble person is certain that the presence of God in their life is the essential element to happiness.

Of utmost importance is NOT what you give, but WHY you give. All giving should symbolize self-giving as the widow in the first reading and the Gospel exemplify. Even the responsorial Psalm says, "The Lord raises up those who are bowed down. The Lord loves the just." Then God will give His reward.

Last weekend we honored our veterans. They gave their lives for our freedom, the freedom to come to Mass and ask God for forgiveness. We come to the altar in humility and trusting in God's providential care that He will nourish us in Word and Sacrament that we may serve Him in one another.

Our Prayer: O Lord, give us a greater awareness of our responsibility to the formation of a Catholic Christian society which includes a deeper awareness of the plight of our homeless within our city, and give us the courage to take part in reaching out to them. Amen.

Quote from Tradition

He waits until his enemies are made his footstool. There is no anxiety in this waiting for Christ, as there would be for us. It shows the merciful will which God has towards us. The Lord is waiting to show us mercy (Is 30:18). All are placed under his feet - that is, some bend their will towards the humanity of Christ, and in this their salvation consists, namely in doing his will. But the wicked who are unwilling are put down, because his will is not fulfilled through them; yet it is fulfilled as far as the work of justice. How long will you refuse to submit to me? (Ex 10:3). And so all things are subjected in their own way. He has placed all things under his feet (Ps 8:7). When he says by one offering he gives the reason why he sits as Lord and not a minister like the priests of the Law, because they could not take away sin with one sacrifice, but had to make frequent offerings. For every high priest is appointed to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. But the sacrifice which Christ offered took away all sins. As it says above, Christ was offered once to take away the sins of many. And so it says that by one offering he has forever made perfect those who are being consecrated, that is, by reconciling and uniting us to God as our head, because the sacrifice of Christ, who is both God and man, has an eternal power of sanctifying. And below it says, Jesus suffered to consecrate the people by his own blood. For through Christ we are perfected and united to God.
