> EPIPHANY / JESUS' ROYAL MESSIAHSHIP OF BOTH GENTILES & JEWS





From the Deacon's Desk: This is the feast of EPIPHANY. The word means to manifest. OK, so what does it mean to us Catholic Christians? It means that Jesus is made manifest, made known to the gentiles in the persons of the Magi. Some of you may re-

member the O. Henry story, "The Gift of the Magi". In short, it's a love story of a young married couple, Della & Jim. Jim had no money to buy a Christmas present for Della and Della only had \$1.87!! They each had one possession that they took pride in. Jim a gold watch handed down from his grandfather and Della her hair which would "make the Queen of Sheba jealous". You know the rest of the story: they sold their only possession for a gift to each other. O. Henry says in closing: "The Magi invented the art of giving Christmas presents. .... I have lamely related to you the uneventful chronicle of two foolish children in a flat who most unwisely sacrificed for each other the greatest treasures of their home. But in a last word to the wise of these days let it be said that of all who give gifts, these two were the wisest. They are the magi."

I relate this story because to me it is not only the value of the gift but the giving from the heart no matter the value, price or material worth. We should never give out of a sense of "duty" but from love.

Last Sunday, Tim, Marylou, Peter and Barbara, Celeste and AI, and Madeline as well as two of Mother Teresa's sisters were blessed with good weather and a warm reception by those who, whether by choice or chance, survive on the streets of L.A. We met the face of God. **Our Prayer:** On this day the Magi adored our Savior, let us also worship Him with joy as we pray to Him:

King of nations, You called the Magi to adore You as the first representatives of nations, give us a willing spirit of adoration and service.

King of justice, You desire to free the poor who have no advocate, be compassionate to the suffering and the afflicted.

Lord. Your name is blessed for all ages, show the wonders of Your saving power to our deceased brothers and sisters.

Father, You revealed Your Son to the nations by the guidance of a star. Lead us to Your glory in heaven by the light of faith. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

**Invitation to Reflect** - The feast of the Magi is an event of great symbolism. The Epiphany commemorates the Savior coming not only to the Jewish people but to all peoples: Gentile, pagan, "outsiders" of all kinds. God's love leaves no one untouched. The Magi, wise in the ways of stars, discovered Jesus. God reveals himself to them in signs. <u>Each of us has "stars" or signs in our own life which, if followed, lead us to God also.</u> Like the Magi, our search must be guided by the Word of God in the Scriptures.

Signs come in all forms: it may be the love we receive from another person; the <u>good example of someone who tries to live</u> <u>by the gospel</u>; <u>an insight that comes in our prayer</u> and reflection; <u>observing someone who is not self-centered</u>; the challenge from a friend to look beyond our own little world; the cry of a child; something we read in the newspaper that calls out to us; even sickness or tragedy in our lives. It is up to us to pay attention and read the signs around us. They will lead us to God if we look with openness and with eyes of faith. When we make a response to those signs, we may not find a baby in a manger, but we will find the face of God in those whom we reach (or those who reach us).

This feast is also a feast of unity. Jesus came to all and we are all one under God's love. Where is there unity in our own world? Where is there disunity? Every family, every parish community, every nation sees the results of the <u>evil of intolerance</u>. As we reach out to those looked down upon, or those considered "outsiders," we do our part to bring about the unity that God envisioned in sending his Son, Jesus, to us.

**Life Focus** - \* How do we reconcile the material gifts we have in our lives with the simple life-style of Jesus? \* What are the different ways we as a community can be like the star and help other people come and worship Jesus? \* Make time each day this week to reflect on who or what are signs calling you to take an action which will lead you to God.


