



#### From the Deacon's Desk:



I ran across an article in a Readers Digest of two years ago entitled: "Happiness, How to Have it NOW." It's about workaholic Carl Honore. He was trying to fit more bedtime stories into ten minutes so he could get to his e-mail

and work. But he found out that, "it's all about slowing down." He said, "It's balance and staying calm and unflustered even when circumstances force us to speed up". The article says one "simple way is to anchor ourselves in the present and discover an activity that defies acceleration - something like meditation, gardening or reading." Then up popped this reflection in the "Living Faith" for Wednesday the 10th. It began, "If I'm too busy to pray, I'm too busy." That pretty well sums up the past three weeks with Advent, Christmas, Epiphany and all, and sprinkled in with New Years and family get-togethers. Sister Svoboda S.N.D. says, "It's good to recall what Jesus did amid the busyness of his daily life, "He went off to a deserted place, where He prayed."

Are you still too busy? Stop! Take time to catch your breath. Breathe in deeply, let it out slowly. Repeat this three times. Now, reflect on today's Gospel: Jesus and Mary and His disciples at the wedding feast of Cana. Recall the incident where Mary says to the stewards, "Do whatever He tells you." Take time to meditate on these five words. What is He telling you?

**Our Prayer:** (For the Gift of Peace) Almighty and everpresent Father, Your watchful care reaches from end to end and orders all things in such power that even the tensions and tragedies of sin cannot frustrate Your loving plans. Help us to embrace Your will, give us the strength to follow Your call so that Your truth may live in our hearts and reflect peace to those who believe in Your love. We ask this in Your Son's name. # **Small Church Community**

Invitation to Reflect - In the wedding feast of Cana we see Jesus pressed by his mother's compassion to respond to a social dilemma. It was a wedding feast, a primal social event within the local community. Marriage bound the community together by linking families through relationships of longevity. The social fabric of the community was strengthened by the celebrations of these unions. It was proper and fitting to celebrate with everyone present.

How embarrassing to miscalculate the needed amount of wine or to be unable to afford the quantity that would allow people to celebrate this major covenantal event! Whatever the circumstances, Mary noted the problem and approached the one person whom she knew could alleviate the discomfort. We have no idea what she thought Jesus would do, but <a href="weethick">we do know that she felt confident in asking him for help</a>. While Jesus resists the appeal initially, like the good son who relents and responds fully in the parable of the two sons (Matthew 21:28ff), he proceeds to respectfully honor her request.

This is not a statement about familial control or God being subject to any human preference. It is a story that depicts Jesus as a man who cared about the needs of those around him. In everyday life, Jesus could be moved to respond in order to meet people where they were. Mary knew this capacity in her Son. She trusted him to reach out and alleviate the struggle in some way. Of course, he made this miracle a sign of his "hour," giving it a profound meaning that Mary would come to understand.

God is concerned about human dilemmas and limitations and chooses to respond. Our petitions, spoken from the depths of surrendered hearts, aware of their dependency upon a generous God, fall upon God's ears and receive a hearing. While we may not know the precise way in which God will respond, we can be assured the voices that cry out are heard.

**Life Focus** - \* Who helped bring your faith to life? How do you do this for others? \* What blessings have come to you beyond what you asked or expected? \* When were you able to talk to those close to you about who you are and what you believe? \* Where has the wine run out in your life? \* Describe a recent "ordinary" event that ended up having extraordinary meaning.
