

What a Teacher Makes:

The dinner guests were sitting around the table discussing life. One man, a CEO, decided to explain the problem with education. He argued, "What's a kid going to learn from someone who decided his best option in life was to be a teacher?" He reminded the other dinner guests what they say about teachers, "Those who can, do. Those who can't, teach." To stress his point he said to another guest, "You're a teacher, Bonnie. Be honest, what do YOU make?" Bonnie, who had a reputation for honesty and frankness replied, "You want to know what I make?" She paused for a second, then began, "Well, I make kids work harder than they ever thought they could. I make a C+ student feel like the Congressional Medal of Honor recipient. I make kids sit through 40 minutes of class time when their parents can't make them sit for 5 minutes without an IPod. Small Church Community

Scripture focus - In today's Gospel we hear Jesus calling the disciples. Jesus calls unlikely, even unworthy people to follow him, but in response to his assurance of forgiveness, we see a generous response to the call. Even Peter, first among the apostles, is first astonished at the power of Jesus and then overcome by a sense of his own sinfulness. But Jesus overlooks Peter's protests that he is unworthy and calls him beyond that to reach out to others.

Like Peter, we risk realizing our own greatness when we say "Yes" to God in Christ. We enter into a partnership, a discipleship, when we consent to God's invitation. We bring to the call humility and an awareness that nothing great can happen of our own doing. It may be necessary for God to reach out and perform minor miracles to convince us the call is real. We may require some purification to be ready. It may take a miraculous catch of some kind to help us realize God's seriousness. But our call is as real as Peter's, and so is the risk. Are we willing? Life Focus - * Relate an experience when you felt a sense of awe or wonder. * What do you think God is calling you to do in your life? * How is God calling you this week to carry out your mission? * Describe an experience when another person helped you overcome fear. * When were you asked to do something you couldn't handle? Where did you find the strength?

"Blessed are they who hope in the Lord." Psalm 40:5 Cardinal Mahony is sending a letter to past contributors to the *Together in Mission* campaign. If you receive this letter, please respond with a generous pledge to support the ministries, programs and services provided by the parishes and schools that receive these funds.

This weekend, we will provide additional information about this campaign that provides funds to 35 parishes and 48 schools that would find it difficult, it not impossible, to operate without them.

On the weekends of February 10-11 and 17-18, we will conduct the in-pew solicitation process so that those who do not receive the mailing will have an opportunity to make their pledges.

As each parish household prayerfully reflects on the amount of the pledge to be made to help these parishes and schools, please reflect on the following questions: Do I really believe that I have a duty to help others who are in need? Is what I give to the work of the Church enough to show how grateful I am for what God has given me? Do I appreciate how important every contribution to Together in Mission is to the people in the subsidized parishes and schools?

Please pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as you consider the above questions and give generously, according to what God has given to you.

One of the more challenging ministries is to the imprisoned, yet Jesus very clearly calls us to minister to them. As part of my deacon formation process, on **Feb. 16-19** I will be participating in a weekend retreat with prisoners at the Lompoc prison sponsored by Kairos Prison Ministry, an interdenominational group that works to bring Christ's love to the incarcerated. There are several things to be done before and during the weekend, and I would like you to prayerfully consider helping me with any of the following:

- Baking six dozen cookies, which will be given to the prisoners during the weekend.
- Having schoolchildren color "shields", pictures of Jesus with an inscription, writing a brief note on the back, and drawing an outline of their hand.
- Prayer vigil: Committing to pray for the weekend participants during a 30 minute time slot during the weekend.
- Prayer letters: writing short notes to the inmates. If you feel moved to assist in any of these ways, please contact me at 799-0921, or patandtom@charter.net. Thank you for helping to bring Christ's unconditional love to those who need it so much.
