From the Pastor's Desk I:

It can be difficult to put the words of Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel into practice. One thing that parents often do after young children have had a fight is to encourage them to make-up.

They want their children to learn that you cannot harbor a grudge forever.

This childhood learning is hopefully carried over into adult life. We learn to forgive, but at the same time become aware of larger hurts than childhood spats. Forgiveness and reconciliation in adult life take place over much more serious things than who gets to play with which toy in the sandbox.

With Lent beginning this Wednesday, this may be a good time for an examination of conscience and to ask in what areas of one's own life forgiveness and reconciliation need to bear fruit.



You and I are challenged to seek and know the depth of God's love for us AND to respond to that love!

Sometimes when we don't have time to listen to God, He has to "throw a brick at us." It's our

choice to listen or not. How are you nurturing that seed? Many times we mouth the words to the songs at Mass. I had a profound feeling two weeks ago when we sang "The Summons." Here are some words from it that are worth meditating on or pondering:

Will you come & follow me if I but call your name? Will you go where you don't know & never be the same? Will you let My love be shown? Will you let My name be known? Will you let My life be grown in you & you in Me? Will you leave yourself behind if I but call your name? Will you care for cruel and kind and never be the same? Will you risk the hostile stare, should your life attract or scare? Will you let Me answer prayer in you and you in Me?

Our challenge: Parents and educators, we need to tell young people what many do not want to hear; consumerism is a shallow way of life, religion is a community affair, the Eucharist is a non-negotiable element of Christian life - you cannot write off the church & call yourself a Catholic. Jesus is more than a pal. He asks us to love one another with a deep abiding love not a brotherly but deep agape love. As Jesus states in this Sunday's Gospel, "Stop judging and you will not be judged.... For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

Our Prayer: Almighty Father, You have brought us to the light of a new day. Keep us safe the whole day through from every sinful inclination. May all our thoughts, words and actions aim at doing what is pleasing in Your sight. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen

Abstinence and Fasting - Abstinence form eating meat is to be observed on all Fridays during Lent. This applies to all persons 14 and older. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday applies to all healthy persons between 18 and 59. Fasting means one full meatless meal per day. Two other meatless meals may be taken sufficient to maintain strength, but together should not equal a full meal. Liquids may be taken between meals. Private, self-imposed observance of fasting on Lenten weekdays is strongly recommended.


