Actually we will be invoking the Holy Spirit to guide us all in revisiting the Catechism of the Catholic Church. We may even get in the vestibule of Purgatory - Where is it? We pray that this Lenten season will be a reawakening of our Faith, a refreshing of our Faith: The Catholic Faith. A realignment just as our cars need realigning so they can be on track and not wear out prematurely. So it is with the Lenten Season - we try to get back on track so we don't wear out prematurely. Remember: Jesus said, "Upon you, Peter, I will build my Church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." He did not say "My Churches". Let's explore His Church. See you Wednesday evening.

Our Prayer: Father God, You bring us to the beginning of Lent. Teach us to be loving not only in great and exceptional moments, but above all in ordinary events of daily life and help us to abstain from what we do not really need in order to help our brothers and sisters in distress. 

Small Church Community

Scripture focus - Jesus has fled to the desert to sort through a powerful experience of affirmation by his Father. In a profoundly public moment of baptismal surrender, he is confirmed as the "Son of God." He must grapple in all humility with the ramifications of this identity. His own understanding of himself would lead to a profound self-surrender to his Father's will. The temptation of Jesus in the desert, as told by Luke, was not the first time Jesus was tempted, nor would it be the last. But Luke, like Matthew, uses these three temptations in a powerful way to depict the frequent experiences of Jesus. He struggled with the difficult possibilities open to him in carrying out his mission right up to the agony in the garden. As a human being he was always free to choose his path. But Jesus was also conscious of his loyalty and relationship with God. Nothing will deter Jesus from establishing the kingdom of God. His deepest trust is to follow God's plan and to carry out his mission according to that plan and none other. Jesus rejects Satan and places his trust in the guidance of God, no matter where that might lead. Life Focus - * Determine a Lenten resolution that will lead you to live more deeply with God, for example, spend 15 minutes in reading the Scriptures each day or in quiet prayer. * Describe a time in your life when you asked for proof of God's care for you. * Recall an incident when you chose to accept or get out of an everyday hardship in your life. * Tell of a time when a temptation revealed something to you about God or yourself. * Relate an experience from your life when you wondered whether God cared for you or not. * What besides "bread" satisfies the hungers in your life?


