From the Deacon's Desk:



Last Sunday two words were attempted to be brought to our minds, namely ALIGN and IN-TEGRITY. Lent is a time to ALIGN or bring into proper relationship or create a parallel. INTEG-RITY is adherence to a moral or ethical princi-

ple; honesty; completeness. One Sacrament which is emphasized during Lent is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. where we reconcile ourselves to our Maker. Take your Sunday Missal and turn to the Prefaces. Each Sunday, a Lenten preface is selected. They have themes; for example, the first theme is "The Spiritual Meaning of Lent." (You give us a spirit of loving reverence for You, our Father, and of willing service to our neighbor....You bring the image of Your Son to perfection within us.") The third preface is "The Reward of Fasting." "We are to master our sinfulness and conquer our pride. We are to show to those in need Your goodness to ourselves." Others deal with "Spirit of Penance" and "Fruits of Self-denial." Check them out. They are worthy of meditation.

Our Prayer for Vocations: Father, give us priestly vocations so that we can continue to be a truly Eucharistic church, strengthened in our discipleship of Jesus Christ Your only Son. Raise up, we pray, men who are generous in their service, willing to offer their lives and all their gifts for Your great glory and for the good of Your people. We make our prayer in the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, through Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

Moses and Elijah reveal that Christ's passage would be through suffering to glory. The voice of God identifies Jesus as God's chosen son, and commands the apostles to listen, to listen to what Jesus has just announced - his approaching death and resurrection. In this passage, the glory of God will be revealed. Life Focus - * Relate an experience of having to do something difficult or unpleasant that helped another person. * Describe a time when you stopped to listen closely to another person. * Relate an event that enabled you to carry on through a difficult time in your life. * What are some "mountaintop" experiences in your life? * What experience these past two weeks helped you see God working in your life? * Describe a hardship you experienced that made you a better person.
