

last week.

Leftovers from last week's homily: Do you realize that the 3rd appearance took place at the Sea of Galilee? My research indicates that the distance from there to Jerusalem was anywhere from 85 to 90 miles! Were they trying to escape a similar fate as Jesus? Jesus invites us to share this Eucharistic feast and to come and eat. We are not to regard the "Eucharistic elements as ordinary bread and wine; they are in fact the Body and Blood of the Lord as He Himself declared. Whatever your senses tell you, be strong in faith.If Jesus says, 'Take and eat, this is My Body' who can have any doubt? Who would dare to question it and say that this is not His Body and Blood?" (Taken from the Jerusalem Catecheses.) We become what we eat. We are called to be Jesus when we exit the church and "feed His sheep" - recognize Him in our neighbor, the handicapped, the poor, those uneducated - we cannot become a religion of insiders. We will find Him in our brothers and sisters in need. "We need to be Jesus to them. It may be the only Jesus your neighbor will ever see." ... Sr. Angelica

Scripture Focus - The focus of this Sunday's Gospel is on Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The short talk stresses the unbreakable relationship between Jesus & his sheep. Where do you experience not really belonging? * Share one of your stronger experiences of conflict in your life (as a teenager, employee, parent, or spouse). How was it resolved? * "Birds of a feather flock together." Relate an experience when you realized you truly belonged to a group. Share your feelings about that experience. * Describe an experience when you felt cared for, felt a sense of belonging, felt connected. * Focus on God's deep abiding love for us. * Speak the truth in a loving way especially in tough situations.
