
From the Pastor's Desk:




Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity - We walked together in harmony in the house of God. (Psalm 55:14)

Scripture Focus - There are many examples in the Bible of farewell speeches. They always include leaving a farewell gift. "Love your neighbor as yourself" had been around for a long time. There was something new in Jesus' command. They were to love each other as Jesus loves. It is to be a totally selfless love. His death on the cross is the highest expression of his love, It is this *love* which identifies the disciples with Jesus. What we believe, how we behave and worship must be motivated by his command to "love one another" as he loves us. This is the necessary mark of a truly Christian community.
