
From the Pastor's Desk:

Today's scriptures bring together the traditions of the New Testament that recall the actions of Jesus. Whether it is bread and wine (like at the Last Supper) or bread and fish (as with the crowds in today's Gospel or with the disciples

after his resurrection) Jesus does the same thing. He takes, blesses, breaks and gives.

These ritual actions of Jesus are mirrored in our own celebration of the Eucharist. Each Sunday we take, bless, break and give. What is merely bread and wine becomes, in the Eucharistic action, the body and blood of Christ. That which is given to us as real food and real drink for life eternal, also nourishes us to go out into the world to be the body of Christ for others. We take what is given to us, the body and blood of Christ, and in turn give of our very selves for others. In doing so, the real presence of the sacrament of the Eucharist becomes Christ really present through us in the world today.

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Why do we pour water into the wine just prior to the consecration?

Greeks added water into wine as it was thick, gritty and too strong. In other words, it was in good taste to add water before drinking. The

Romans loved Greek things and adopted manners of Greeks. It was not originally a Jewish custom, but it became so at the Passover meal, hence part of the Mass. Fourth century catechists said water represents humanity, wine divinity. Once water is put into the wine it can't be taken out again. The symbol is Jesus' humanity can never again be separated permanently from God. A piece of bread is put into the cup as fermentation - another Roman custom. The priest breaks a piece of the host and places it in the chalice and says, "May the mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it," or words similar. The priest says silently, "Lord Jesus Christ with faith in Your love and mercy I eat Your Body and drink your Blood. Let it not bring me condemnation but health in mind and body."

May we never nullify the significance and importance the Eucharist brings through our indifference and selfishness. May the Eucharist never be considered a ho-hum experience but what it truly is: A partaking of the essence and spirit of Jesus who we become through this bonding of God's people around the altar of sacrifice, the Altar of Thanksgiving, the altar of joy in knowing we have the gift of eternal life awaiting us.

Our Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, we worship You living among us in the sacrament of Your Body and Blood. May we offer to our Father in heaven a solemn pledge of undivided love through loving service to our sisters and brothers in need. We ask this in Your name. Amen.

Scripture Focus - Luke's Gospel stresses Jesus' table fellowship with people of all sorts. This and other themes emerge in his account of Jesus feeding the multitude. (1) When Jesus asks the apostles to give the people something to eat themselves, it is a thinly veiled hint that they are to imitate him in feeding the hungry. (2) His generosity is suggested by the fact that "they all ate until they had enough" and underscored by the quantity of leftovers, enough to fill twelve baskets. (Twelve symbolized all humanity.) Some people at Corinth had forgotten the significance of the Eucharist and were nullifying it by their selfishness. The rich members of the community were turning the common meal into a private bash. Paul reminded them that the Eucharist bonds us to all the people around God's table.

Life Focus - * When have you felt you were running on empty? * Do you hunger in your family, work or community? Name one thing you can do to make a difference. * Christ related with all types of people. What type of people do you find easy to include in your life? What type of people are easy to exclude? * Today, who are the people who do not feel welcome in our Church? Can you take any practical steps to welcome one of these people?

Why is it so important to register in the parish?

- 1. In the situation of the death of a family member, it is important that either the deceased or the family member of the deceased is registered in the parish so that contact with the family can be made. It is very difficult if there is no registration information or even the knowledge of the family or the deceased loved one. If there has been a serious illness or if there has been confinement at home for a long time, we as a parish family should be notified so that the sacraments of penance, Eucharist, and the anointing of the sick might be available. It is important that the contact should be made at the Rectory Office.
- 2. Very frequently we get requests for letters of recommendation to be a Godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation. If the parties involved are not registered it is difficult to make a recommendation as to whether they are practicing Catholics or not. If a letter of recommendation is being requested, some background is needed before the letter can be written.
- 3. St. Joseph Parish is a wonderful place to be married. We welcome our young couples preparing for the Sacrament of Matrimony. It is important to register in the parish so that we do have Canonical Jurisdiction for your marriage. We are delighted to help you prepare for marriage.
- 4. We welcome your children to come to know our Lord through Religious Education. However, it is also very important that you are registered and participating in the parish as we seek to educate your children. That includes Sunday Mass and taking advantage of our Liturgy of the Word for children at the 9:00 am Mass.
