Birthdays are lots of fun! Parents even plan birthday parties for their one-year-old child who, at that age, doesn't understand all that is going on. As we celebrate the birth of John the Baptist today we recall that we really don't know the

exact date of his birth. The choice of this day to celebrate is not so much about John as it is about Jesus.

You'll notice that we are celebrating six months before Christmas, a timeline determined by the annunciation story in Luke's infancy narrative (check out Luke 1:36). Even as we honor John, we understand that the celebration of the life and deeds of any of the saints is really about Jesus and what he inspired the sainted person to be and do.

Jesus is the core of our faith. Without his dying and rising our faith would mean nothing. The second reading of the vigil of today's feast puts it this way: "Although you have not seen Jesus Christ you love him; even though you do not see him now yet believe in him" (1 Pt 1:8).

BIRTH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST REAL GREATNESS





From Deacon Don's Desk:



The birth of St. John the Baptist is called a "solemnity" because of its great importance. The feast dates back to the 4th century and is celebrated six months before the Lord's birth. It is near the summer solstice and is appropriate

since after St. John's birth the days (daylight) become shorter in contrast to after Jesus' birth they begin to increase. Remember, "I must decrease and He must increase"? We know little of St. John's inner life, but we know he had the courage to tell King Herod that it was sinful for him to live with his brother's wife. St. John, while imprisoned, sent his disciples to Jesus to follow Him.

A week age, several bishops including Cardinal Archbishop ordained 60 deacons in the Santa Barbara region. Scripture Focus - One day, celebrating the liturgy of the Jerusalem Temple alone, Zechariah meets the angel Gabriel. Gabriel tells him that his wife, Elizabeth, will have a child and that he will call him John (Acts 1:13). The name John, in Hebrew means "Yahweh has shown favor."

Zechariah responds to his predictions and promises with a query, "How shall I know this? I am an old man, and my wife is advance in years." Presuming this question means unbelief, Gabriel discloses his identity and strikes Zechariah dumb "until the day these things take place."

Why is it so important to register in the parish?

- 1. In the situation of the death of a family member, it is important that either the deceased or the family member of the deceased is registered in the parish so that contact with the family can be made. It is very difficult if there is no registration information or even the knowledge of the family or the deceased loved one. If there has been a serious illness or if there has been confinement at home for a long time, we as a parish family should be notified so that the sacraments of penance, Eucharist, and the anointing of the sick might be available. It is important that the contact should be made at the Rectory Office.
- 2. Very frequently we get requests for letters of recommendation to be a Godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation. If the parties involved are not registered it is difficult to make a recommendation as to whether they are practicing Catholics or not. If a letter of recommendation is being requested, some background is needed before the letter can be written.
- 3. St. Joseph Parish is a wonderful place to be married. We welcome our young couples preparing for the Sacrament of Matrimony. It is important to register in the parish so that we do have Canonical Jurisdiction for your marriage. We are delighted to help you prepare for marriage.
- 4. We welcome your children to come to know our Lord through Religious Education. However, it is also very important that you are registered and participating in the parish as we seek to educate your children. That includes Sunday Mass and taking advantage of our Liturgy of the Word for children at the 9:00 am Mass.
