## From the Pastor's Desk:

I. In the Lectionary cycle during Ordinary Time, the first reading is chosen to complement the Gospel for the day. Today's story of Abraham busily preparing a feast for the Lord is paired with the story of Martha and Mary from Luke. As

we can see, this pairing makes it evident that the concern in the Gospel is not so much about Martha's busyness after all, Abraham is praised for his readiness to fix a feast - as it is about welcoming the Lord. Mary's welcome is through attentiveness to Jesus. Abraham's welcome is through hospitable attentiveness to the Lord.

In our daily concerns we may sometimes lose sight of being attentive to God. Some people use simple reminders to help them not forget about God. A prayer taped to the bathroom mirror, a religious image on the desk, a screen-saver of a holy site, or a CD with religious music in the car are all simple ways to remain attentive to the Lord in the busyness of the day.

**II.** Late last Sunday morning, I received a fax from Cardinal Mahony. It stated that the law suits against the Archdiocese had been settled outside of court, thanks be to God. May this phase of the Clergy Sexual Abuse Scandal be brought to a closure. As a result, safeguards have been put in place for the protection of our children. I am grateful to Mimi Bloeser and our committee for their invaluable work. This is something that should have happened years ago. I don't know if the old saying is even applicable here: "Better late than never." What a tragedy this has been! Would that it had been prevented! May it not happen again!

Innocent priests have also been falsely accused. Such false accusations have brought them deep pain and suffering. Priests in general also feel this pain and suffering. The very small percentage of guilty priests have simply been thrown out on the street by their bishops. Religious communities have kept their guilty members. They care for them and supervise them after they pay the penalty of their abominable crimes. I think this is far more Christian for all concerned.

I think Cardinal Mahony has done his best to heal willing victims. He has also sought to safeguard confidential records of priests as guaranteed by state law. The Archbishop has apologized and is selling non-church related property to meet the lawsuits. No parish will suffer as a result. Of course, there are those who do not want forgiveness, reconciliation, and healing. God forgive them and the perpetrators! Only the Lord can bring us to this necessary place.

### From Deacon Don's Desk:

The Gospel this Sunday is about Martha and Mary. Who do you identify more with? To me there are two sides - the "practical" or action side and the contemplation side. We seem to be overwhelmingly pre-occupied with the "practical"

everyday things and leave little time for the contemplative (prayer) side of our lives.

Our challenge in this Gospel is to "chose the better part" the "part" that lasts. Question: what challenges in Jesus' teaching do we see for our church and society? Could it be that we need to pray more fervently for our service men and women? I recently received an e-mail that said, "Remember, only two defining forces have ever offered to die for you: Jesus Christ and the American soldier. One died for your soul, the other died for your freedom."

This weekend we had four people who have been part of St. Joseph parish community, in one way or another, enter into eternal life.

To be a Catholic Christian is not only out of step with society on some moral issues, it is also out of step "schedule wise." You may have heard me say that before. We need to make prayer time part of our schedule. Don't know what to pray for? Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you. We need to remember those who have been victims of abuse, whether it be physical, sexual or mental. We need to pray for the perpetrators as well as the victims, that they may receive healing & forgiveness. As Fr. Rolheiser said, those who act out violence may have been victims themselves which causes this illness to be "played out."

# **Small Faith Community**

Scripture Focus - In today's first reading we get a glimpse of the importance of hospitality in the desert. The Gospel continues this theme of hospitality. Martha prepares the meal in the kitchen while Mary sits at the Lord's feet. Martha takes exception to Mary's action, but Mary is being hospitable in her own way. Jesus teaches Martha to balance her work with a bit of listening. It is not that her work isn't important, but action by itself can easily become mindless busyness. It's a question of balancing priorities. Notice that both women are close friends of Jesus and they are listed as doing the work of disciples. Life Focus - \* Who are you most like, Mary or Martha? Tell of an experience from your life to show this. How can you develop the other side of yourself? \* Tell of an experience in your life when your attention was focused on the less important thing in a situation. \* What are the contributions of women to your small church community? To your parish? \* As an individual what do you do to prepare yourself to listen to Christ? Do you have a special time or place for listening? \* Who, more than anyone, makes you feel at home? How? How can you show this kind of hospitality to others this week? \* How can your life be more centered and clear?
