Our prayer of petition is put in the context of God's will, not ours. Such prayer may not be always what we desire. But it is how Jesus taught us to pray.

Mission Co-operative Collection

A second collection will be taken **August 4 and 5** for the Diocese of Makeni which covers the northern part of Sierra Leone, a small country on the west coast of Africa.

The first evangelization of the area started in the 40's and 50's. Though Islam had made great inroads in the territory, the response of the people to Christianity has been encouraging. Now we have a small, vital Church.

The diocese has been affected by the rebel war. We had to abandon all parishes and our missionaries are refugees. The international airport is closed, banks are closed, the postal services are not functioning, and schools and universities are locked. Thousands of people have lost their jobs and the hardships are becoming unbearable.

We need your assistance to alleviate the sufferings of our people and to continue our pastoral work.

Small Faith Community

Scripture Focus - In today's Gospel Luke gives us his version of the Lord's Prayer, slightly different in wording from Matthew's version. It would seem that Jesus taught his disciples how to pray without giving them a precise formula. The central request is for the coming of God's reign. Physical nourishment is necessary as people await the reign, and Luke suggests that it will be a long wait by adding the significant "each day." One attitude is singled out: mutual forgiveness modeled on God's own forgiveness. One quality of prayer is stressed: perseverance. Eventual success is assured, and in the process one stays in touch with God.

Life Focus - * When has there seemed to be no answer to your prayer? What has been your response? Describe the change in yourself. * From your experience, what keeps you praying or not praying? * We all need "daily bread." What does this bread include for you? * How are you affected when you are slow to forgive? * Who in your life do you need to forgive (include yourself)? * Reflect on a time when your prayer was answered in a different way than you expected.
