#### From the Pastor's Desk:

An appeal to outside authority is one of the classic positions often adopted in disputes. One of the parties points to - God, the Constitution, the zoning commission, the professor, mom (you fill in the blank) - to buttress his argument

that he is right. Such an approach has a certain element of danger in it. The one who makes the appeal presumes that the authority will side with him, something that doesn't always happen. After all, sometimes mom is so fed up that she sends both arguing children to their rooms!

The man in today's Gospel wanted Jesus to order his brother to give him his share of the inheritance. Jesus refused to be drawn into the dispute. Instead he used the opportunity to expand his teaching on wealth - and what it does and doesn't get us!

Disputes are natural in life. But the way in which we approach them can reveal how well we have taken the message of Jesus to heart. As he tells us in this week's Gospel: "One's life does not consist of possessions" (Luke 12:15).

#### **Mission Co-operative Collection**

A second collection will be taken this weekend for the Diocese of Makeni which covers the northern part of Sierra Leone, a small country on the west coast of Africa.

The first evangelization of the area started in the 40's and 50's. Though Islam had made great inroads in the territory, the response of the people to Christianity has been encouraging. Now we have a small, vital Church.

The diocese has been affected by the rebel war. We had to abandon all parishes and our missionaries are refugees. The international airport is closed, banks are closed, the postal services are not functioning, and schools and universities are locked. Thousands of people have lost their jobs and the hardships are becoming unbearable.

We need your assistance to alleviate the sufferings of our people and to continue our pastoral work.

#### From Deacon Don's Desk:

Monday, July 30, was the feast day of St. Peter Chrysologus (380-450 AD). He was known as Peter of the Golden Word. To fight paganism he used short sermons as his weapon. Many of the sermons are still recorded. "No originality of

thought but full of sound doctrine is recorded." Pope Benedict XIII declared him a doctor of the Church 13 centuries after his death. Here is part of one of his sermons: "A virgin conceived, bore a son, and yet remained a virgin. This is no common occurrence, but a sign; no reason here, but God's power, for He is the cause, and not nature. It is a special event, not shared by others; it is divine, not human. Why then, man, are you so worthless in your own eyes and yet so precious in God's? Why render yourself such dishonor when you are honored by Him? Why do you ask how you were created and do not seek to know why you were made?...He has made you in His image that you might in your person make the invisible Creator present on earth; He has made you His legate, so that the vast empire of the world might have the Lord's representative."

Read this several times and different thoughts will arise and make you think. It makes me think how ungrateful I am of others when God honors each person.

**Our Prayer**: Heavenly Father, You made Peter Chrysologus an outstanding preacher of Your Incarnate Word. Bless and protect our priests. May the prayers of St. Peter help us to cherish the mystery of our salvation and make its meaning clear in our love for others. We ask this in the name of Your Son, Jesus Christ our redeemer. Amen

What can you do today that will last no matter what happens? \* What helps you find a balance between taking reasonable care of yourself and hearing the needs all around you? \* Recall how wanting to control something or someone really controlled you. \* Do you take time to visit with people & with God? What things tend to "get in the way?"
