
over the other is not an earth-shattering decision, and time does not stand still until a choice is made.

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Fr. John, our missionary from Africa who visited three weeks ago said that when he told his Muslim family that he was going to be a Catholic priest, his uncle said: "If it's to easy, you better come back home".

It's not easy being a Catholic Christian in this day and age. Fr. Richard Leonard SJ writes: "This Gospel is both a stark reminder of the costs involved in following Jesus and a comfort to us in the church today. Sometimes we can turn the Christian community into a "feel good" society. If Christians at home, at work, in society, and on the international stage just go along with what is trendy or current because we're frightened of conflict of because we want to be seen to be part of the crowd, then we're not worth of this Gospel".

Fr. Mark Link, another Jesuit, had a little story from a "Calvin and Hobbes" cartoon: Calvin, the smart little boy, has a talking tiger (Hobbes). One day Hobbes finds Calvin sitting under a sign that reads "Kick in the butt for one dollar!". "How's business?" asks Hobbes. Calvin says, "Awful! And I don't know why because so many people need a good kick in the butt!".

That is what Jesus is trying to do in this Sunday's Gospel. He is trying to give people the wake up call.

Dov. Seidman in his ethics book, "How", says (speaking on collaborating with partners) "the tapestry of human behavior is so varied, so rich and so global that it presents a rare opportunity, the opportunity to OUTBEHAVE the competition". He sites a Michigan hospital that instructed it's doctors to apologize when they make mistakes. Guess what? The malpractice claims dropped dramatically.

Disagreements need to be conducted with charity, dignity, careful listening and compassion. That's a good mark of a Catholic Christian; it's not always a picnic.

My Prayer: May the Eucharist give us the courage to divide the crowd for the right reasons. May we be a blazing fire that casts light on darkness where people are exploited and injustice smothers the growth Christ wants to see in the human family.
