What's the calculation to be made in following Jesus? Today's Gospel presents a rather stark view: "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:33).

St. Francis of Assisi took this message literally. He stood in the town square of Assisi, renounced his inheritance in his father's lucrative fabric business, and stripped off all his clothes, standing there naked to show his desire to follow Jesus.

I'm not suggesting that we leave all our clothing at the church door on Sunday! But the intensity of Francis' desire to become a disciple can be an inspiration for all. Is there one area of our life that could use more zeal in being a faithful follower? Is there some aspect of the Christian message that we are a bit lukewarm about? Is there something that we could let go of or put aside that would give us more time or energy to act as a disciple of Christ? Father William

From Deacon Don's Desk:

The Mass is our most powerful prayer. Often referred to as the "source and summit of our faith."

In Eucharistic Prayer I after the "Holy, Holy,

Holy..." the priest bows and blesses the offerings. He asks God to accept the sacrifice of His Son for our redemption. He prays for the Church, the Pope and bishops and all the faithful and all present. He places his hands over the host and chalice; by this action Christ, the victim of sacrifice, substitutes Himself for us. The priest blesses the offerings and bows to perform the Consecration (means: to make holy). He identifies himself with Christ and pronounces the words Christ used at the Last Supper. The Consecration of Mass: God makes Good Friday present (as Fr. Will so often reminds us that "we make present that which happened 2000 years ago") on the altar. At Mass we offer the sufferings and sacrifice of Jesus for the atonement for our sins and of the whole world.

It is here at the Consecration that I give a slight bow and ask God to forgive me for being in His presence. It is now time to focus on the elevation of the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ and to say most humbly, "My Lord and My God," and striking the breast is meant to be a sign of humility (hopefully not a display of false piety). As the Body and Blood are brought down to the altar, we bow to show our respect. "In the most Blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the church, namely Christ Himself, our Pasch and the living bread, which gives life to all through His flesh - that flesh which is given life and gives life through the Holy Spirit"...Vatican Council II. Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests. Our Prayer: Lord be merciful to our brothers and sisters who are suffering, especially those for whom the summer's heat is a painful burden, those who live in loneliness and fear, and those close to death, that they might experience, through us, the compassion of God our Father. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.
