From the Pastor's Desk:


When Paul writes to Timothy in the second reading today, he is encouraging him in the life of faith. The section we hear today concludes with Paul admonishing Timothy to guard the rich trust of faith and love that is his in Christ

Jesus. Paul bids Timothy to do so with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us.

For the Catholic community in the United States, the first Sunday of October is designated "Respect Life Sunday." As Catholics, our respect for all life is rooted in the Bible and in our Trinitarian faith. We hold that each person is sacred because we have been made in the image of our creator God. We believe that each person is sacred because we have been redeemed by the Son who gave his life on the cross. And we believe in the sanctity of the human person because of the gift of the Spirit that dwells within us.

Our respect for life is not limited to the unborn and the elderly. It extends to EVERY person - something that can be difficult to do at times. But that is the vision to which we are called.


