From the Pastor's Desk:

Radio and television evangelists will often turn to Scripture and use it as a proof text to make certain points. In doing so, they ignore some of the inherent contradictions that exist in the biblical text. So how do Catholics understand the

reference in today's second Letter to Timothy which says, "All Scripture is inspired by God?"

For starters, we do not believe in a literal interpretation of the Bible. The Bible is first and foremost a theological document which speaks of our relationship with God and God's relationship with humankind. The Bible is certainly not a scientific treatise, or even necessarily a history book, although we can find historical events in it.

God's inspiration of the biblical text is revelation; in that revelation God shows that he is one who acts. Our God is not a distant, uncaring God, but one who interacts with humankind. Today's Gospel says as much: "Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones?" (Luke 18:7)



Sunday Nursery: We have caretakers for the 9:00 am and 10:30 am Masses, holidays included!



Scripture Focus - Luke's Gospel is noted for his preaching on prayer. He also pays great attention to women, especially poor women. Widows were dependent on other men in the family. A widow had no state aid, nor could she work. If she had no one to help her, she had to beg. The widow in this story comes to the judge to help her get her rights. Since she was too poor to offer a bribe, he at first ignores her. But she kept insisting on her rights. The judge was afraid of her. He eventually gave in. If such a worthless judge would answer such pleas, would the loving God do any less? On the contrary, says Jesus, God will respond to people. God will bring them swift justice. Will God find people with the same unconquerable trust as this widow?

Life Focus - * In what ways has your parish community imitated God's compassion by responding to the cries for justice in neighborhood, country and world? * Reflect and share an instance when ongoing prayer in your life carried you through a difficult time. * How often in your prayer life are you persistent enough to ignore the answer you want to hear and persistent enough to heed the answer God wants you to hear? * What are you doing to bring about God's justice in the world? In your own small world? * Who has "nagged" you into doing the right thing or into

becoming the person you could be?

Why is it so important to register in the parish?

- 1. In the situation of the death of a family member, it is important that either the deceased or the family member of the deceased is registered in the parish so that contact with the family can be made. If there has been a serious illness or if there will be confinement at home for a long time, we as a parish family should be notified so that the sacraments might be available to them. Contact should be made at the Rectory Office.
- 2. Very frequently we get requests for letters of recommendation to be a Godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation. Some background is needed before the letter can be written. If the parties involved are not registered it is difficult to make a recommendation as to whether they are practicing Catholics or not.
- 3. We welcome our young couples preparing for the Sacrament of Matrimony and are delighted to help you prepare for marriage. It is important to register so that we do have Canonical Jurisdiction for your marriage.
- 4. We welcome all of your children to come to know our Lord through Religious Education. However, it is also very important that you are registered and participating in the parish as we seek to educate your children. That includes Sunday Mass and taking advantage of our Liturgy of the Word for children at the 9:00 am Mass
