From Deacon Don's Desk:



As we approach Veterans Day I find it appropriate to reprint a letter that appeared in the Press-Telegram over four years ago.

Patrick Henry <u>did not</u> leave out references to God in his speech.

Patrick Henry - I believe that much of the history of this country has been erased from our culture and many of our textbooks to eliminate any reference to God. Patrick Henry, who is called the firebrand of the American Revolution, is still remembered for his words, "Give me liberty or give me death." Here's what he actually said:

"An appeal to arms and the God of hosts is all that is left to us. But we shall not fight our battle alone. There is a just God that presides over all the destinies of nations. The just battle sir, is not to the strong alone. Is life so dear or peace so sweet as to be purchased at the price of chains and slavery? Forbid it almighty God. I know not what course others may take, but for me, give me liberty, or give me death."

Scripture Focus - In this passage we find Jesus teaching in the temple. The Sadducees, who believed in the absolute authority of the law, approached Jesus with a question about the law. These Sadducees belonged to a group who did not accept the Jewish tradition that believed in the resurrection of the dead. They objected to those who believed that any afterlife was merely a continuation of earthly life. None of us know exactly what to expect after death, but we do have the promise of eternal life and we believe in the fullness of that life.

Were you successful? Why or Why not? * Tell of your first experience with death. * Write down three things that you believe about life after death.
