From Deacon Don's Desk:



We've all received from time to time e-mail that escapes our "delete button." I believe that this one was destined to be a survivor. I took this from St. Cornelius' bulletin of two weeks ago - it was given to me from a friend. It's well worth

reading and relates to the first Life Focus question in our Small Faith Community elsewhere in this bulletin.

"Wright is Right!!"

When Minister Joe Wright was asked to open the new session of the Kansas Senate, everyone was expecting the usual generalities, but this is what they heard:

"Heavenly Father, we come before you today to ask your forgiveness and to seek your direction and guidance. We know Your Word says, "Woe to those who call evil good" but that is exactly what we have done.

We have lost our spiritual equilibrium, and reversed our values. We have exploited the poor and called it the lottery. We have rewarded laziness and called it welfare. We have killed our unborn and called it choice. We have shot abortionists and called it justifiable. We have neglected to discipline our children and called it building self esteem. We have abused power and called it politics. We have coveted our neighbor's possessions and called it ambition. We have polluted the air with profanity and pornography and called it freedom of speech and expression. We have ridiculed the time honored values of our forefathers and called it enlightenment.

Search us, God, and know our hearts today; cleanse us from every sin and set us free. Amen!"

The response was immediate. A number of legislators walked out during the prayer in protest. In six short weeks, Central Christian Church, where Rev. Wright is pastor, logged more than 5,000 phone calls with only 47 of those calls responding negatively. The church is now receiving international requests for copies of this prayer from India, Africa and Korea. Commentator Paul Harvey aired this prayer on his radio program, "The Rest of the Story," and received a larger response to this program than any other he has ever aired. With the Lord's help, may this prayer sweep over our nation and wholeheartedly become our desire so that we again can be called "one nation under God."

We'd like to wish each of you and your families a happy and blessed Thanksgiving Day.

Our Prayer: Oh Lord, give us strength in temptation, endurance in trial & gratitude in prosperity. Help us to long for Your words that give us instruction & courage. Amen.

Luke's main theme is that it will do no good to try to predict the end time. For followers of Jesus, the important thing is to believe that God will be with them no matter what happens: "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Life Focus - * Describe a time when you had to persevere in order to stand up for what you believed to be right. * With wars, famine, suffering, etc., how do you find God's love and trust in your life? * Speak of a time in your life when a crisis occurred and you were fearful.
