
From the Pastor's Desk:

From Deacon Don's Desk:


Leftovers from last week's homily: We are nearing the end of the Liturgical year. We are completing the Gospel of St. Luke. After Advent we will begin the Gospel of St. Matthew.

There's an ancient legend that the devil, master of disguise, tried to get into heaven by pretending to be the Risen Christ (our King). He took with him his demons disguised as angels of light and had them cry out the traditional first part of the welcome psalm: "Lift up your heads, oh ye gates of heaven, lift up your doors and the King of Glory shall enter!" The real angels looked down at what they thought was their King returning in triumph from the dead. So they in turn shouted back with joy the refrain: "Who is this King of Glory?" The devil then made a fatal mistake. He opened his arms and spread his palms and declared, "I am!" The angels immediately slammed the gate of heaven and refused to let the imposter in. They saw right away that there were no marks of nails in his palms. The imposter had no wounds of love, had not paid the price and had not carried his cross.

Jesus is coming!! Look busy!! Not like busy-bodies. Jesus says remain vigilant at all times, seek Him in all things, in every person and every experience. "By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Scripture Focus - During his adult life Jesus was often put down because he "welcomed sinners and ate with them." Now he is condemned to die with criminals. The man we have come to know as the good thief turns to Jesus and calls him simply by name, "Jesus," and begs only to be "remembered." By doing so he simply acknowledges the inscription on the cross and that Jesus has a kingdom to enter. The thief gets more than he ever asked for: He will enter paradise on that very day. In a word, the criminal was *saved* by Jesus the "savior." The good thief's plea becomes a ray of hope for all, by turning in faith to him who came as a "savior."

Life Focus - * What helps you believe that Jesus remembers you? * How does this Gospel give you hope of being saved? * What is lacking in you when you are unable to respond to those suffering unjustly? * Relate an experience when you received a gift you didn't deserve. * Speak of a time when you stood silently witnessing the pain of another. * From your experience, describe a time when you failed to respond to someone being unjustly treated. * When were you treated unjustly and everyone

kept silent?
