You might be inclined to feel sorry for Ahaz in the first reading and to wonder why God was so angry that this king wouldn't ask for a sign. The prophet Isaiah had come with a message from God when Ahaz and his kingdom of Judah

were under attack. God wanted to reassure Ahaz: he told him not to let his courage fail. Then he offered to give him a sign. The reason Ahaz wouldn't ask for a sign was because he didn't think God would be of much help. He had decided to rely on the strength of Assyria instead. No wonder God sounds so annoyed! God wants to give a sign, and certainly Ahaz and all of Judah need one that is "deep as the nether world or high as the sky." So he gives it anyway - to Ahaz and to all of us who have come after him. God gives us the sign of the Virgin giving birth to Immanuel. It was a sign Ahaz felt he didn't need. We do.



Scripture Focus - Matthew's version of Jesus' conception is a statement of Christian faith in Jesus as the Son of God. It begins with Joseph's confusion over Mary's pregnancy. They were engaged to be married but had not yet lived together. Sexual relations with anyone except the engaged person were considered adultery, and punishment was severe. God reassures Joseph in a dream that the child has been conceived by "the power of the Holy Spirit." Matthew sees Joseph as a model of faith. He recognizes the power of God working in ways he cannot understand. The child's destiny is indicated by his name: The name *Jesus* means "Yahweh helps" or "Yahweh saves." Matthew stresses the meaning of *Emmanuel*. "God-With-Us," to emphasize Jesus' divine Sonship. **Life Focus** - * Describe a time when you felt your trust had been betrayed by someone you loved. * Describe a time when you had to struggle to trust God in a difficult situation. * When did you change a decision of yours after prayer and reflection?
