Here we are at perhaps the timeliest Sunday of each church year, the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. To protect ourselves form this powerful feast day, we sometimes ask, "could a *Holy* Family have anything

to do with our families?" This Holy Family has everything to do with us. This feast with its wise and honest readings, speaks of our lives to us. In the first reading from Sirach, good children bring comfort to their mothers; sometimes fathers' minds fail and children are tempted to be inconsiderate or to revile them. In the passage from Colossians, families need kindness, mercy and patience. Spouses have duties toward each other, but can sometimes grow bitter. Children lose heart when parents nag. In the Gospel, Joseph has to uproot his whole world to save his stepson's life. Are these today's Scriptures or today's news stories? What are we to do with a liturgy like this? Pay attention.

Paul Harvey recently quoted the words of Yuri Gargarin, the first Russian to orbit the earth. Yuri's comment was: "I am here above the earth and I look around and I do not see a God." Then Mr. Harvey quoted the American astronaut Lov-

ell, as he later orbited the earth, "I am orbiting the earth and I look around and I see God everywhere!" I am still awe struck by God becoming like us. Lowering Himself to our state. Jesus immerses Himself into our humanity to take on our sins - to help us understand that He transforms us to be saved by His suffering, death and resurrection. "By the power of the Holy Spirit He was born of the Virgin Mary and became man!" It is at this time that we should all bow in humility that God would humble Himself in becoming man. Bishop Fulton Sheen is guoted as saying, "Christmas is the day when the God-Man says to every person in the world, "My mother Mary gave me a human nature like your own in all things but sin. I have shown you how one can overcome the worst of situations and live in joy." He says, what Jesus is saying is "what does it profit Me if I am born in Bethlehem and am not reborn in your hearts?" The four Christmas Masses, feast of the Holy Family, the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, the Epiphany of the Lord, and His Baptism show us the different aspects of God's "self-disclosure in the Lord Jesus, in whom He is really "Emmanuel - God is with us." Our Prayer: Lord God, You desired to be born within time and shared our weaknesses and experienced the day-today life of men and women, so we ask You to help us grow in Your love that we may share eternal joy in praising Your glory. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus - Matthew's story of the "Flight into Egypt: is modeled on the stories of Moses and his escape from the Pharaoh. Matthew's main intent is to say something about who Jesus is. He wants us to make an act of faith in this Jesus. Like the people of Israel escaping from Egypt, Jesus is the new Israel. He is God's son. On a very human level, the Gospel also portrays a "holy" family, in which loving parents go to extreme lengths to protect a threatened child.

Life Focus - * Relate a time in your life when you experienced family unity in the face of danger, difficulty or crisis. Why was there unity? * Relate a time when you experienced family disunity. Why was there disunity? * Describe an experience of God guiding you out of danger or difficulty. How did God "speak" to you? Through a friend, family member, a stranger, your feelings, prayer? * What can you do to defend and promote gospel values at home, at work, at church and in society? What keeps you from doing it?
