From the Pastor's Desk:


I. There is so much mystery surrounding the three Gentiles from the east who followed a star to find Jesus, that we don't even know what to call them. "Astrologers" says the Gospel today, yet sometimes we hear them called

"Wise Men" and even "kings." Obviously, their exact identity wasn't important to the story. What was important? Their status as outsiders, if you will, aliens. Also important: their number - not the exact number three, but the fact that there were more than one of them. In this day of global positioning devices, satellite maps and turn-by-turn transmitted directions, we can't imagine anyone setting out on a journey of hundreds of miles only vaguely guided by a star and an ancient prophecy. In this we are correct - no one should ever do such a foolhardy thing. But three? Three is the number of the Divine. Three is a community, a family. Together these three astrologers could set out on this fantastic journey. If you are following a star, never travel alone.

II. "That this Christmas season afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted, we pray to the Lord," comes from the teaching of an early Church Father. He said, "Christ came to afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted." By it he meant that over and above our selfless love for our families, we are to show to those in need a self sacrificing love. Love for them is not always easy. This kind of love is shown by those in our parish involved in Project Achieve and in feeding the homeless on skid row here in Long Beach and in Los Angeles. We in this parish for the most part are comfortable. We are called to comfort the afflicted in ways that require some self sacrifice. Getting involved with the Catholic Worker in San Pedro or in Los Angeles would be another way of showing self sacrificing love. The founder of the Catholic Worker is being considered for sainthood. She is Dorothy Day, a radical voice for the poor. She would become the first saint to have had an abortion. (This was before her conversion to the Church. Venerable Dorothy Day had been an atheist and Marxist.) She deeply repented of this horrendous sin after her conversion.

III. I am grateful to our Liturgical Environment Team, to our Choir, Acolytes, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and all who made this a very beautiful Christmas and Epiphany.

I'm sure that resolutions abound but one that should be put on your list is that of EUCHARISTIC ADORATION.


Our Christmas "Preface" says, "You fill our hearts with joy as we recognize in Christ the revelation of Your love. No eye can see His glory as our God, yet now He is seen as one like us. Christ is Your Son before all ages, yet now He is born in time. He has come to lift up all things to Himself to restore unity to creation and to lead us from exile into His heavenly kingdom."

This Sunday is the feast of EPIPHANY (manifestation) of our Lord; now His plan is revealed - our eternal salvation which shows Him as the light for all people. It's time for us to reflect and pray about this gift. Why pray? Christ doesn't want you to pray because you have to. He wants you to pray because He loves you and likes talking to you, just as you like talking with others. Sometimes we feel that God doesn't answer our prayers, but He does. His answers are "Yes", "No" or "I have a better plan for you." Pray forms can be summarized by A.C.T.S. or Adoration, Contrition (sorrow for sins), Thanksgiving, Supplication (your request of God).

Our Prayer: Oh Lord, the wise men followed a star to find You and we are asked to do the same. Help me to become a better "light" by helping others find Jesus by serving You in them. Amen.

Scripture Focus - Epiphany means "manifestation," a revelation of Jesus as truly God. Matthew and Luke show this child to be divine through stories of "signs and wonders" when Jesus was an infant. Matthew's account of the visit of the three magi also shows the Church's mission to the Gentiles. Matthew's audience, largely Jewish Christians, was struggling to accept the presence of Gentile Christians in their community. Matthew shows in this Gospel passage that the salvation of Gentiles as well as Jews was indeed God's plan.

Life Focus - * What helps you stay focused on God's presence in everyday situations where God is usually not mentioned? * From your experience, when have you come to appreciate people you used to pass by or not notice? * How do we reconcile the material gifts we have in our lives with the simple life-style of Jesus? * The wise men worked hard to find Jesus, and we are asked to do the same. What are some ways you have found Jesus in your life? * How can you find Christ and worship him? * What gifts do you bring to the Christ Child?
