#### From the Pastor's Desk:

Lent began just ten days ago. We resolved to fast, pray and give alms as a way of strengthening our Christian commitment and uniting with Jesus on his road to Calvary. Many of us have already begun to waver in our resolve.

Lent seems too long and the road too hard. So today's readings are timely.

If ever there was a man with a daunting task ahead of him, it was Abram. Leaving his homeland and the gods of his family was an irrevocable step into a future based on faith in the one, true God. "I will be with you. I will bless you," the Lord promised Abram and still promises us. In the second reading we are reassured again. "You can do this," Paul seems to say. The strength we need comes from God: the plan isn't our own, but is God's design. Today's Gospel provides the greatest reassurance of all. With Peter, James and John we see the transfigured Jesus speaking with Moses and Elijah. Like Peter, we'd like to stay there gazing, to build tents to contain the vision, especially when God the Father himself tells us to listen to his Son. But when we listen we hear him say, "Rise, and do not be afraid." It is time to move forward on our Lenten journey.

#### From Deacon Don's Desk:



I wish to share with you two thoughts that moved and nourished me. Hopefully, they will have some meaning for you during this Lenten season:

1. St. Augustine: "Our pilgrimage on earth cannot be exempt from trial. We progress by means of trial...Christ was tempted by the devil. In Christ you were tempted, for Christ received His flesh from your nature, but by His own power gained salvation for you; He suffered death in your nature, but by His own power gained life for you; He suffered insults in your nature, but by His own power gained glory for you; therefore, He suffered temptation in your nature, but by His own power gained victory for you. Do you think only of Christ's temptations and fail to think of His victory?....He could have kept the devil from Himself; but if He were not tempted He could not teach you how to triumph over temptation."

2. Blessed Teresa of Calcutta: "The devil may try to use hurts of life, and sometimes our own mistakes, to make you feel it is impossible that Jesus really loves you, is really cleaving to you. This is a danger for all of us. And so sad, because it is completely opposite of what Jesus is really wanting, waiting to tell you...He loves you always, even when you don't feel worthy. Jesus loves you tenderly; you are precious to Him. Turn to Jesus with great trust and allow yourself to be loved by Him. The past belongs to His mercy, the future to His providence, and the present to His love."

At the 9 am Mass it was heartwarming to see the Catechumens being encouraged to continue their faith journey to their Confirmation. We are so blessed to have such dedicated catechists led by Peter Baine. His support staff and the sponsors give of themselves and without recompense. Well, maybe their "pay" is out of this world.

**Our Prayer**: Oh Lord, You bring us to share Your concern for the good of all. May we work together to build up the earthly city, with our eyes fixed on the city that lasts forever. Healer of body and soul, cure the sickness of our spirit so that we may grow in holiness through Your constant care. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.

Jesus again hears his own call, a reminder of who he is and the great trial that lies ahead. Peter, James, and John, the same three disciples who will be with him during the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, are blessed with a vision of Jesus as the risen Lord in all his glory. They hear God's voice and clear call: "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." This vision and call move them down the mountain and toward the promise of glory on the other side of suffering.

How did the risks influence your decision? \* How have you recognized in your own life God's plan for you? \* How do you see yourself as a disciple of Jesus? 
