From the Pastor's Desk:

I. One God. Three Persons. That's the doctrine. Scholars try to wrap their minds around it. Skeptics try to debunk it. Preachers sometimes try to explain it with illustrations of shamrocks or triangles. Today's liturgy does none of those

things. Today the church celebrates God, who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Today we rejoice that such an amazing God loves us. We believe in the God "who is, who was and who is to come." We marvel that such a God wants us to be sons and daughters. The Trinity truly is a mystery, in the religious sense of the word. It is not a puzzle to be solved; rather, it is a truth to be embraced in faith.

II. Cardinal Mahony has asked parishes to help defray the cost of the abuse settlement. I have discussed this request with our parish and finance councils. After listening to them, I have decided with their advice to send the Cardinal ten thousand dollars. He is asking for much more (\$25,000 to 55,000). <u>This</u> is what we can afford at the present time due to the construction of the handicappable restrooms and the repaving of our parking lot. Our PAC also needs renovation.

This grant does not come from the weekend collections but rather from the parish's share of our recent festival. The exact numbers are not in yet but we did very well, so I am told.

Our finance council helps me be a good steward of your financial contributions to our parish community. I am grateful to the finance members for their wise and prudent advice.

If you would like to personally donate to this settlement, please make your check out to St. Joseph Church and mark it "abuse settlement." Parish and finance council members are also available to discuss our parish's involvement in this matter.

It is impossible to say it once through, giving FULLEST possible attention to each word, without a change, infinitesimal perhaps but real, taking place in the soul." ...Simone Weil, French philosopher and mystic.

Don't give up - actually, do give up some time away from the TV and close you eyes and just BE. Fr. Peter Kumle, Passionist priest once said, "If the LA Times was the Bible and TV was the tabernacle, we'd all be mystics!!" What a change in the world that would make.
