


St. Vincent de Paul - Bundle Sunday

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION Thursday, June 5, 6-8 pm

From Deacon Don's Desk:

Continuing on prayer: Give God the glory.
Last week I used a quote from Blessed Teresa of Calcutta: "Seek Him in the tabernacle. Fix your eyes on Him who is the Light. Until you know deep inside that Jesus thirsts for you..."

At this time we need to bring ourselves before the Blessed Sacrament and earnestly pray for our newly ordained priests, that they will be strengthened and guided by the Holy Spirit in their ministry. They will need all of our prayers. As you saw in last week's Tidings, some will be serving two parishes. Pray for strength that they will be able to serve God's people. Then next week (June 7) the Cardinal will ordain 19 deacons, one of whom will be our own Tom Halliwell. Keep Tom and Pat in your prayers as well.

Eucharistic Adoration will be this Thursday, June 5, beginning at 6 pm. At 7:30 we will have "Evening Prayers" (Liturgy of the Hours). At that time we will incorporate prayers for those who are sick and in distress and in need of our prayers. At 7:45 we will close with Benediction. Adoration outside of Mass is meant to stimulate our appetites for our next Sacred Meal. It is meant to be mostly a silent time between you and Jesus. A time to reflect and let Him in and let Him do the talking. Our Prayer: Good and gracious God, You have called us through Baptism to discipleship with Your Son, Jesus, and have sent us to bring the Good News of salvation to all people. We pray that you protect our newly ordained priests and deacons. Keep them in Your love, give them strength in temptation, endurance in trial and gratitude in prosperity. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus - Today's reading is the conclusion of the final teaching from the Sermon on the Mount. We must determine God's will for us and give God glory, seeking no recognition for ourselves. Jesus is both model and teacher in this. Simply hearing the words of Jesus isn't enough. We must put them into action, build them into the very structure and fiber of our lives. If we do this, then no matter how violent the storms of our lives, we will stand firm on a foundation of God's love and protection. Give God the glory.
