From the Pastor's Desk:

What does God want? From ancient times people have tried to find out. Bargains have been struck with God; offers have been made and so have demands. Has anyone really wanted to know what God wants, or are we

really asking what we have to do to get God to give us what we want?

In today's readings we have poignant words from God. Through Hosea God says, "It is love that I desire, not sacrifice." In Matthew's Gospel Jesus says, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." Both passages ask us to be honest - there's nothing we can really offer that will "buy" us what we want from God. The prayers we say, offerings we make, rules we keep don't require that God give us anything in exchange. God wants to give us what we *need* - freedom and healing from our sins.



Scripture Focus - Today's Gospel shows Jesus being rejected by some of the Pharisees. Caught up in observing the Law to the letter, they fail to see the generosity of God's love shown by Jesus. Jesus asked Matthew, a customs collector, to follow him. This man was regarded as a sinner by the Jews & someone to be avoided & scorned. God's mercy is not held from those who appear to be unworthy. In fact, it is precisely to these that God's love reaches out. People are saved by God's graciousness, not by their own efforts or accomplishments. Observance of the law without love for others is not genuine religion. Life Focus - * When have you experienced having your life together and being guite independent? When have you experienced a time when you couldn't "do it" alone? * The Pharisees complain about Jesus to his disciples instead of going to him directly. Describe a time in your life when you did not have the courage to speak directly to a person you disagreed with or who offended you but complained to others instead. * Relate a time when you helped others to see God's love in their lives regardless of how sinful they were. Relate a time when you realized that a past event was part of the growing process necessary in getting to know God better.
