From the Pastor's Desk:

Danger enters our picture of discipleship today. We are God's chosen flock, his beloved children, yet there is a shadow side. Jesus our brother showed us how to be disciples, including how to carry a cross and die on it. Today's

first reading and responsorial psalm are dark and forbidding at first, but each one ends with a song of praise and hope in the Lord. In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that Jesus' power over sin and death is given to everyone. The most reassuring words of all come from Jesus in today's Gospel reading. He doesn't promise that we won't be harmed, but he tells us we have nothing to fear. The God who notes the fall of every sparrow and counts the hairs on our heads will be with us through it all.


QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

Adult: What role does fear play in my life and what role does faith play in my fears?

Child: When someone near me is afraid, how do I help him or her?

Teen: What makes me afraid? How can I remember that God is always with me?



From Deacon Don's Desk:

Want to hear some "Good News"? Read the Gospel. It's good to know that I am worth "more than many sparrows"!! There's hope for me. There is nothing new under the sun that has not been said before. Example? How about "actions speak louder than words"...St. Anthony of Padua, sermon before his death in 1231 AD. Or "apple of his eye" ... from Deuteronomy around the time of Moses. "Practice what you preach" ...from a sermon by St. Gregory.

The Gospel will speak differently to each person that meditates on a portion of the readings. As you read the Gospel in search for the point (God's word to you), ask yourself what <u>is</u> God saying to me right now. This is what Christian bible reading is about. Sometimes we miss the obvious right at this moment. Remember the story I told sometime ago about Sherlock Holmes and Watson who were camping? Sherlock says, "Watson, look at the sky and tell me what you see." "I see millions of stars." Sherlock asks, "And what does that tell you?" Watson says, "Astronomically it tells me there are countless galaxies. Astrologically, Saturn is in Leo. Theologically, I see God is all powerful and we are insignificant. And you, Holmes?" Sherlock pauses and then says, "What I see, Watson, is that someone has stolen our tent!"

Do words like "fear no one" "do not be afraid" resonate? How about: "everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before My heavenly Father." We are all called to be prophets and this calling is not to be taken lightly.

Our Prayer: Father, God, help us to detest what is evil and cling to what is good. Help us to show respect, to rejoice in hope, be patient in trial and persevere in prayer. Never let us grow slack but fervent in spirit in serving You. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus - Today's Gospel deals with persecution and how the disciples were to respond. They were to have complete trust in Jesus. They were to have no fear of those who would threaten their lives. They were to stand strong before the divisions that might come. God. who loved them so much that he counted the hairs on their heads, would not abandon them. Matthew's purpose in emphasizing this care in times of trial comes out of the situation of his community. Many people had rejected the Good News announced by Jesus, and they were rejecting his followers and throwing them out of the synagogues. Through the Gospel, he reminds them that Jesus will be with them through the Spirit as he promised. Life Focus - * Describe a time in your life when you were afraid and God seemed far away. What helped you to overcome your fear? * When have you allowed someone

or something to control you or prevent you from speaking the truth? How did you feel about it afterward? * We ask our children to "say no to drugs" and encourage them not to give in to peer pressure. Describe a time when you were swayed by what your peers would say about you. * Relate a time when you found it difficult to heed God's command "...do not be afraid of anything."


