Most reassuring of all are the words of Psalm 145: "The Lord is faithful in all his words and holy in all his works. The Lord lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down."

From Deacon Don's Desk:



There are three things I want to share with you: First, last Sunday we assisted the Missionaries of Charity with feeding the homeless. What a joy-filled day the two good sisters provided. God works in mysterious ways. You'll have to ask Al

Shaheen how the picture of Jesus was used as the "credit card" for a gas fillup for the good sister's van.

Secondly, we all need consolation at various times in our life. Sometimes it is most difficult to see the positive side of things. At springtime you walk in an apple orchard and a high wind brings down a blossom. You say, "What a pity it died so soon. It would have been a gorgeous apple." The blossom lived, even if but a short time. It accomplished something during its brief time with its perfume that sweetened the air; its beauty brightened the earth and it signaled the arrival of spring. God gave a perfect blossom and we need to look at the achievement, not at the "promise" that could have been.

Finally, Bishop William Lori, Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus writes: The Trinity is the most sublime and central mystery of our faith. As a result of God's self-revelation in and through Jesus, we can come to a much clearer understanding of who God is. We learned that Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit hovered over Him at his baptism and at the Transfiguration. Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and the Virgin Mary at Pentecost. It's a communion of love that gives joy and meaning to our lives as we seek union with God and with one another. Knights, I urge you to read the whole article in the June issue of Columbia. Our Prayer: Almighty Father, whenever I seek to take pride in what I do, remind me of the way things really are. The only good I have comes from You, all that is mine is my weakness. Make me humble so that You may come to me. Amen.
