From the Pastor's Desk:

Today's Gospel offers the stories of the field planted with weeds, the amazing plant grown from a tiny mustard seed, and the effect of a small amount of yeast in a large amount of flour. Jesus brilliantly paints a picture of one of

life's perennial mysteries: Why is it that evil people live among the good and even thrive? Jesus tells two seemingly unrelated parables about the mustard seed and the yeast that certainly address those questions. The smallest amount of good *or* evil can greatly affect everything around it.

Today's other readings provide an answer to the conundrum of good and evil: *None of this is up to us.* The reading from the Book of Wisdom reminds us there is no god like our God, who is master of all yet governs with lenience. In his Letter to the Romans Paul goes so far as to say we don't even know how to pray the way we should. We need to rely on the Holy Spirit to pray for us. What *is* up to us? To be the wheat that will be gathered in at harvest time.

From Deacon Don's Desk:



"Matrimony - pathway to happiness and holiness." That was the theme of last week's married couples retreat at Mater Dolorosa Retreat Center in Sierra Madre. It was once said "retreats are a high form of spiritual direction

where we are immersed in the Word of God. The Passionist Fathers have a way of bringing into focus this Love that God has for us. We only need to see His only Son on the cross to realize the depth of His love for us. This challenges us to be more grateful for this gift of all gifts. But the challenge goes further: "It is a call for us to forgive as He forgives us."

Four couples from our parish went on retreat. Some said it was a "transformation" for them. Others came back enthused to share the joy that they experienced - I'm sure you will hear from them.

Some points that struck me: Marriage is a "covenant" NOT a contract. Contracts can be broken, covenants cannot be broken. Narcissism (it's about me) is a danger and cause of many downfalls. "Is this marriage fulfilling me?" Remember the vows (covenant)? Struggles have redemptive capabilities. How do we turn struggles into pathways to love? Answers come through Faith, through Sacraments, communication with the words, "you just might be right." Prayer, most important! "Pray as you can, NOT as you cannot." Matrimony: a pathway to forgiveness. (How many times must I forgive? Seven times? No, I say, 70 times seven times.) Read Psalm 91:15, "Call Me and I'll be there." Why do you marry? Reply: love will see us through. "Love does not sustain marriage, marriage sustains love." ...Deacon Valencia. Read Gen. 2:18.

There is much more to tell you, but we don't want to cut down another tree! Remember the lnk Spots' song of the 40's? "You always hurt the one you love, the one you didn't mean to hurt at all..."

Our Prayer: Merciful God, let me make frequent use of the wonderful Sacrament of forgiveness You have given us. Grant that my sins may be pardoned and I may grow in Your grace. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus - In today's Gospel Jesus tells three parables that describe the kingdom of God. In the first we hear about a field where weeks and wheat grow together. It was difficult to tell the weeds apart from the wheat. To cut or pull the weeds while the wheat was growing would hurt the wheat. When the crop was full grown, however, the weeds could be pulled without endangering the wheat. In the Christian community, we find the same situation - good and bad grow together, and none of us is wise enough to weed out the bad without harming the good. God, the "Master of the Harvest," will make this judgment at the end of time. In the meantime, we must be nonjudgmental and practice patience.

Life Focus - * Describe a time when you found it difficult to be patient but doing so brought about a positive outcome. * Relate an experience in your life when you were glad that someone was patient and gave you additional time.
