#### From the Pastor's Desk:

Do we ask for them at all?

## From Deacon Don's Desk:



As I mulled over the thought of a Wednesday evening of review of our Faith, I pulled out a paper that I had written in 2000 while in "deaconate formation." It dealt with

"Sacraments," specifically, the Church as a Basic Sacrament. An expression struck me from Kloppenberg. He likened Christ to the sun as the source of light for our world and our moon, which has no light of its own but reflects the light of the sun. The Church (moon) is the symbol of the reality of Jesus. This is the fundamental aspect of the church. The Church should reflect the light of the sun (Jesus) to the world. I was nourished by the ambition of the Church that is to SAVE and NOT judge, to SERVE and NOT to be served, and to bring the Good News to all, so that the fullness of the kingdom of God will be ours.

What is the role of the prophet? What would your prophetic message be today? Would it be to prepare the way of the Lord for people through knowledge of salvation by forgiveness of sins? Would your message be the sacredness of life, the respect for life?

Its purpose is to update you on the "global settlement of the civil lawsuits" and "explain how we hope to emerge from this tragic chapter in the life of our Church." Scripture Focus - The Gospel today speaks of true wisdom, a priceless treasure to be sought with all one's heart. In the first comparison Jesus uses, a man discovers a treasure that was so valuable that he "sold all he had and bought the field." In the second comparison a pearl merchant discovers a pearl worth more than all his other possessions. Common to both stories is the marvel of discovering such a prize and giving everything to gain possession of it. The point of both parables is that gaining the treasure of God's saving love is worth any sacrifice. Life Focus - \* Describe a time when a decision you made seemed right or wise. Name a time when a decision you made seemed to be wrong or unwise. What made the difference in these decisions? \* Relate an experience when you were able to uncover a "hidden treasure." What helped you to see its value? \* What in your life now is most valuable to you? How do you find God present in that value?


