From Deacon Don's Desk:



"What goes around comes around." Where have you heard that before? Fr. Peyton was famous for promoting the Rosary and coining the phrase: "The family that prays together stays together." It's time to think about holy people

that have gone before us. Here are some sayings from saints: St. Peter Chrysologus, bishop (feast day July 30) -"Why then, man, are you so worthless in your own eyes and yet so precious to God? Why render yourself such dishonor when you are honored by Him? Why do you ask how you were created and do not seek to know why you were made?" St. Ignatious of Loyola (July 31) - When Ignatious reflected on worldly thoughts, he felt intense pleasure, but when he gave them up out of weariness. he felt dry and depressed. Yet when he thought of living a rigorous life of the saints he not only experienced pleasure when he thought about it, he still experienced great joy even after he dismissed the thoughts. Words of Luis Gonzalez writing about Ignatious. St. Eusebius (Aug. 2) -Writing from prison: "I managed with difficulty to complete this letter. I asked God constantly to keep the guards away hour by hour, and to allow the deacon to bring you some kind of greeting in writing, not simply news of my suffering. So, I beg you to keep the faith with all vigilance." St. John Vianney (Aug. 4) -"We had become unworthy to pray, but God in His goodness allowed us to speak with Him. Our prayer is incense that gives Him the greatest pleasure... When we pray properly, sorrows disappear like snow before the sun." "I often think that when we come to adore the Lord, we would receive everything we ask for, if we would ask with living faith and with a pure heart." Pray as if your life, your eternal life, depended on it...Deacon Don.

Our Prayer: Lord, have mercy on Your people. Fill us with Your gifts and make us eater to serve You in faith, hope, and love. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus - Jesus is mourning the death of John the Baptist. But even though he is troubled, Jesus is aware of the needs of those around him. Instead of focusing exclusively on his own needs and concerns, he reaches out to heal others and even to feed a great multitude. This miracle had Eucharistic implications for the early Christians. Moreover, he continues to feed the poor and the hungry through his Church. When the disciples suggested that he send the crowd away to "buy some food for themselves," Jesus tells them, "Give them something to eat yourselves. "The Christian community is likewise commanded to feed the hungry in its midst. The Eucharist would be an empty ritual if it didn't motivate people to do what Jesus did.

Life Focus - * Recall a time when you felt mournful, threatened or afraid, but the needs of others took priority. * Recall a time when someone helped you in your time of need. * Name a time when you helped another who was in material or spiritual need. * What are people in your life hungry for? Plan one response. * Relate an experience when you received beyond what you ever hoped for.


