From the Pastor's Desk:

Today we step out of the sequence of Sundays in ordinary time because September 14 falls on a Sunday. This is the solemn feast of the Exaltation - the Triumph - of the Holy cross, a feast that dates back to the fourth century,

when St. Helen, the mother of Constantine, journeyed to Jerusalem and found what was believed to be the remains of the cross on which Jesus died. From that time on, the church has encouraged veneration of the cross - not just pieces of the true cross, but the images of the cross that adorn churches everywhere. She invites people to see the cross as the glorious means of our salvation rather than as a sign of a shameful death by execution. So here we are in autumn, six months away from Lent and Good Friday, taking a day to remember: There is power in this cross that brought us salvation. We can't save ourselves; only Jesus could save us. Once again the responsorial psalm antiphon provides a summary: "Do not forget the works of the Lord!"
