Scripture Focus - In this parable of the vineyard, each element of the story has another meaning. The property owner represents God. The first group of slaves represents the prophets. They were sent by God to the people before the exile. The second group represents the prophets sent after the exile. Neither group had any good effect upon the people. Rather they were beaten, killed and stoned. When the owner sent his son (Jesus), they dragged him outside the vineyard (Jerusalem) and killed him also. The listeners to the parable were led to judge the tenants (themselves). Because Jesus had been rejected by the religious authorities, the Kingdom would now be given also to the Gentiles.

Life Focus - * What or who has helped you during a period of rejection? * When have people outside the Church seemed to have more understanding and love than those within? * Describe a time when you were so set in your ways that you wouldn't accept repeated invitations to change. * Describe a rejection in your life that turned into something positive. * How might you miss or reject the good God sends each day?
