From Deacon Don's Desk:

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. October 7 is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The importance of the Holy Rosary cannot be overstated. The word Rosary means "Crown of Roses." St. Louis de Montfort says, "The rosary

is a veritable school of Christian life" because of its beauty and power. It's a humble, practical and powerful means of contemplation and a great source of blessing for those who pray it for the whole world. He calls it the "Breviary of the common people." The prayers are the most basic in our tradition: The Lord's Prayer and the Angelic Salutation (Hail Mary). The Glory Be to the Father is taken from the praver of adoration and praise within the Book of Revelation. It's a compendium of the life of Jesus and Mary. In the 9th century the monks recited the 150 psalms (those who were illiterate recited the Our Father 150 times). In the 11th century the Hail Mary was added to the Our Father. In 1214, the Blessed Mother appeared to St. Dominic and instructed him to pray the rosary to fight heresy. The rosary devotion got its present form about 1500 AD. In 1917, Our Lady appeared to the visionary children and demanded, "Say the Rosary everyday....pray a lot and offer sacrifices for sinners....I am Our Lady of the Rosary." She urged prayer for world peace and a holier life. The last words of Louis Pasteur to his nurse before he died were, "Tell my wife that I died reciting the rosary." Many miracles are attributed to the saying of the rosary. Look up the major battle of Lepanto (Christians over the Turks) in which the victory is attributed to the multitudes praying the rosary. Do not underestimate the power of the Blessed Mother through praying the rosary.

Our Prayer: God of glory, impress on me the value of humility as a means of attaining true glory. Help me to humble myself in my own eyes as well as in the eyes of all. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

Scripture Focus - In the Scriptures, meals are always occasions of sharing of life, memories and intimacy. This simple human experience represents the rich life shared between God and his people. The wedding banquet especially looks to the end time when God and his people will find a final sharing of life with each other. In this parable the first guests invited refuse to come. The king tells his servants to invite everyone, "the bad as well as the good." The Church will never be a perfect community of saintly people. All are invited. The only requirement is to receive the Good News willingly. God doesn't care about the clothes we wear. The point is that to share in the heavenly banquet, one must sincerely be open to the Lord. **Life Focus** - * Relate an experience when you knew you had to change your behavior and you chose not to. * Describe an experience when you received an invitation and made up excuses because you didn't want to attend. * Who would you rather not be with at the same table? Why? * What has the Church done to make you feel part of the community? * On what occasion did you feel most out of place in a group?
