#### From the Pastor's Desk:

When we read today's second reading, we ought to be able to replace the phrase "the church of the Thessalonians," with the name of our own parish church, and read Paul's words as if he had written them for us. Indeed, he did

write them for all who are followers of Jesus Christ. We can read them today and derive the same comfort and pride that the Thessalonians did; we can also face the same challenge.

Truly, the Gospel did *not* come to us in word alone. It has come to us "in power, and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction." Therein lays the challenge. Like Cyrus in the first reading, and every other king of Israel and every other person anointed in baptism, we have been called by name. It is God who empowers us. We will always have to do more than listen to God's word. We will have to act on it.



Scripture Focus - Matthew makes it very clear that two opposing political groups have united to trap Jesus: If he supported paying taxes to Rome, he would be accused of being a traitor to his "own" people. If he refused such payment, he would be charged with acting against the government. Jesus is not fooled. He turns the situation back at them. It is clear that they have accepted Roman rule because they can produce a Roman coin. It belongs to Caesar; it has his image and inscription on it. So Jesus says if it belongs to him give it to him, but "give to God what is God's. "He is telling them that there is a Kingdom higher than that of Caesar. All people are made in the image of God. They belong to God, and Jesus calls them to give their lives to God, not to earthly concerns. Life Focus - \* Relate an experience when you felt pressured into making a decision contrary to your principles. \* Describe an experience of being caught in a no-win situation with family, at work or in society. \* What belongs only to God in your life?
