From the Pastor's Desk:

The God of the Old Testament is often called a God of wrath. The high drama, violence, battlefields, and anger that run through the books of the Old Testament can leave us with a picture of a God who is stern, forbidding, quick to

punish, and demanding of justice. Today's first reading is a passage from the Book of Exodus which reveals the tenderness, the loving kindness of our God. "I am compassionate," says God in self-description. Take care how you treat your neighbor.

It is important to remember that this love for others has always been part of the law of Israel. Jesus did not invent this; he remembered it, lived it and called others to live it. In a world that had gone crazy with dissecting the law to extract every possible meaning from every angle, Jesus refused to participate. Here is the greatest law, he tells us: love.

All Saints Day is this Saturday, November 1. The Vigil Mass will be Friday, October 31 at 7:00 pm. Mass on Saturday will be celebrated at 9:00 am. Being on Saturday, this is <u>not</u> a holy day of obligation.

Make me a channel of your peace, It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, In giving of ourselves that we receive, And in dying that we're born to eternal life.



Scripture Focus - Sometimes we hear people speak of the God of the Old Testament as a harsh judge, while the God of the New Testament is a loving and compassionate God. But there is only one God. Today's first reading from the Book of Exodus deals with the Ten Commandments and some specific ways they are to be lived and understood. These commandments are not burdensome and oppressive. In fact, they are essential if humankind is to live a free civilized life. They will ensure our happiness. In the Gospel Jesus' enemies try once again to trip him up. They think he will speak against the Law of Moses. But Jesus agrees that the greatest commandment is to love God with one's whole being, with one's heart and mind and soul. The second commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," follows from and completes the first. This twofold command sums up the Law of Moses and the teachings of all the Hebrew prophets. Life Focus - * How was it tough to love someone this week? * What keeps you from loving God, your neighbor or yourself? Of the three, which for you is the hardest to love? * How have you shown concern for another in a simple way this week? * What/who helps you stay centered on what really counts in life? * Relate an experience when you treated another as you would want to be treated.
