# From the Pastor's Desk:

If you have been to Rome and visited the Basilica of St. John Lateran, you might wonder why the dedication of this particular church building is commemorated all over the world. It's a beautiful church, yes, but it is only one of

many, many beautiful churches in Rome. And if you haven't been to Rome, this celebration might seem even more unlikely and obscure. Even when you learn that the Lateran Basilica was one of the first churches dedicated by Emperor Constantine as an official site for Christian worship - public worship after years of secret meetings for Mass - you might question making its dedication of such importance.

You will find the answer in today's Scripture readings. This is a feast to celebrate the *endurance* of the holy Catholic Church. It isn't about a building. It is about *us*, the people of God, the church. We are God's building, built on the foundation of Jesus Christ.



"It was the best of times......" and it WAS the best of times. The first week was walking the streets and byways of St. Francis of Assisi. We began to understand the love he had for Jesus. Franciscans are the largest orders (3) in our

Church - though the Jesuits may dispute that. As I reflect on the Catholic Church as a whole, I am beginning to understand more fully what Jesus promised: "I will build my Church and the gates of hell will not prevail against it." (Mt. 16:18). The last part of the Apostles Creed says, "I believe in the one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church...." This is explained very well in the pamphlet titled, "Pillar of Fire, Pillar of Truth" including how God speaks to us through the Bible, tradition and the magisterium. It references the Catechism of the Catholic Church and talks about Jesus "supernaturalized the sacraments, energizing them with grace. He made them more than symbols." We have a resource and can get it for you - just ask.

**Prayer before a crucifix:** Here I am good and gentle Jesus, kneeling before You. With great fervor and desire I ask You to instill in me lively sentiments of faith, hope and love.
