### From the Pastor's Desk:

In today's second reading St. Paul assures us that we "are not lacking in any spiritual gift." However, we certainly could not conclude this from the first reading or the responsorial psalm! In these, the writers sound like petulant chil-

dren trying to blame God for their mistakes and shortcomings. Isaiah cries out for all of us (Is 63:17): "Why do you let us wander, O Lord, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not?" (Oh, so when we wander away from God it's his fault?) Even the psalm antiphon has an odd twist to it: We ask the Lord to make us turn to him. (This would be so much easier than the gift of free will we've been given, wouldn't it?) Jesus, however, will not let us off the hook. "Watch!" he admonishes us. If we are going to be saved, it's up to us to be ready.
