From the Pastor's Desk:

St. Luke likes to include little homey details in his stories. One detail in today's Gospel passage has an interesting message for families. We are told that when Mary and Joseph presented their baby son at the temple, they of-

fered the sacrifice of a pair of turtle doves or two young pigeons, as the law of Moses prescribed. Perhaps Luke was being kind by simply writing about the sacrifice this way. More likely, he knew his readers didn't need an explanation. But we do: The law of Moses in Leviticus 12:7-8, required that a *sheep* be sacrificed after the birth of a child. It went on to say that if a family *could not afford a sheep*, two turtle doves or pigeons could be offered instead. In the very public setting of the Temple it is likely that most parents did everything they could to come up with the money to pay for a sheep. Mary and Joseph could not afford the best for their son. Of this we can be sure - it made no difference to their baby at all!

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Well, it's the last message of the year, and in it we offer you our sincerest blessings for a healthy, prosperous and spirit-filled 2009. May your family continue to grow in His Love.

This message comes on the feast of the **Holy Family**. I offer you excerpts from Pope Paul VI "Nazareth, a Model."

"Nazareth is a kind of school where we may begin to discover what Christ's life was like and even to understand His Gospel. Here we gradually may even learn to imitate Him.

"Here we can learn to realize who Christ really is. Here everything speaks to us, everything has meaning. First, we learn from its silence. If only we could once again appreciate its great value. Second, we learn about family life. May Nazareth serve as a model of what the family should be: its enduring character and exemplifying its basic function in society; a community of love and sharing; the perfect setting for rearing children - and for this there is no substitute. Finally, in Nazareth, the home of a craftsman's son, we learn about work and the discipline it entails. I remind everyone work has its own dignity, though it is not an end in itself. Its value, character are derived not from its economic system, but rather from the purpose it serves. In closing, I express my deep regard for those who work for a living. I point to their model, Christ, their brother, who is a prophet in every cause that promotes their well being.'

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, help us to live as the Holy Family, united in respect and love. Bring us to the joy and peace of Your eternal home. Grant this through Your Son, Christ our Lord. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The Gospel reading begins with the simple scene of a devout Jewish family obeying the Law. The holy man Simeon then meets them and says that this child will fulfill the hopes of Israel. Not only that, he will be a "revealing light to the Gentiles." One of Luke's dominant themes is salvation for everyone, Gentiles as well as Jews. This simple and strong description of the Holy Family concludes with their return home to ordinary daily life in a small village.

Life Focus: * In what way does your family express the love of God to each other? To others outside the family? Where does your family need healing? * Reflect a time or event(s) in your childhood that you now realize deepened your faith. * In your life, what families have had an effect on you? How? * Relate a time when your choice put you at odds with your family or friends. * Tell of an experience when you, like Simeon, could grasp the value of another person and the good that person could bring about.
