

Last Sunday was an exceptional one for Tina & me. We visited the Skirball Cultural Center featuring "A Blessing to One Another: Pope John Paul II & The Jewish People." It traced Karol Wojtyla as a boy living with his family in a Jew-

ish owned apartment thru WWII where he studied underground & worked in a quarry, his rise from priest to bishop to cardinal. In Krakow he established close ties with the Jewish community. Then as Pope he attempted to heal 2000 yrs of separation between the two religions by becoming the first pope to enter a Jewish synagogue in 2000 years. It is said that he spent his life looking for deep spiritual values he believed are shared by all humanity. There were many differences but he found we shared one thing in common, "some version of the golden rule."

The prayer he left in the Wailing Wall on Mar. 26, 2000: "God of our fathers, You chose Abraham and His descendants to bring Your name to the nations; we are deeply saddened by the behavior of those who in the course of history have caused these children of Yours to suffer, and asking Your forgiveness we wish to commit ourselves to genuine brotherhood with the people of the Covenant."

Our Prayer: Lord God, teach me to see the living presence of Your Divine Son in the Eucharist. Make my faith so vivid that I will gladly come to encounter Jesus in every Mass. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.


