From the Pastor's Desk:

Why do some folks care so much about when the Last Day is coming? When they hear St. Paul's words, "Time is running out," they ask, "Exactly how much time do we have left? Can you give us a date so we can make plans?"

When we read today's Gospel, the answer is pretty clear: The time is now. "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Jesus says, echoing words his cousin John said before him. But we want to know when - it wouldn't do to repent too soon, would it? Well, Jonah did tell the people of Nineveh how much time they had: "forty days more." These wise people did not wait until day thirty-nine to repent. They repented after the first day of Jonah's visit to their city.

CALL AND RESPONSE

From Deacon Don's Desk:



In today's readings we begin with the prophet Jonah proclaiming, "Forty days and Nineveh will be destroyed." The people repented. They asked for forgiveness. St. Paul, in the 2nd reading, is just as urgent in his pleading to the Corin-

thians. The Alleluia verse says, "the kingdom of God is at hand....believe in the gospel." Mark's Gospel describes Jesus calling to Simon, Andrew, James and John, "Come follow Me. I will make you fishers of men. They abandoned their nets and followed Him."

Well, it's all about "Vocations;" each of us has been called by our Baptism to be a servant. The Responsorial Psalm gives us a nudge, "Your ways, O Lord, make known to me: teach me Your paths..."

Have you invited someone that you know that has or may have leanings toward a vocation? Age is not important. Many may just need to be invited; how about asking, "Have you ever thought of becoming a priest?" A little question may light that little fire inside.

Fr. Kenneth Roberts' autobiography branded him with the title of "Playboy to Priest." He is quoted as saying, "I ran hard and fast to deny what deep inside kept nagging at me. When I could deny it no longer, I sought God's will and I have never for a single second regretted my 'leaving all to follow Him." Our priests and especially our Archbishop have been through some rough times with much bitterness shown to them. We should never say harmful things. We should speak so as to encourage and say things that will really help others. Harmful words may lead to anger, then to wrath, slander and bitterness, even malice. Instead we should show compassion and kindness. In other words, be kind and forgiving. Jesus forgave us, didn't He? He had every right to show anger, but He gave us the path to righteousness. Come, follow Him. Our Prayer: All powerful and ever-living God, let not our faults and weaknesses obscure the vision of Your glory or keep us from the peace You have promised, but direct Your love that is within us, that our efforts in the name of Your Son may bring us to unity and peace. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.

Scripture Focus: Today's passage begins Jesus' preaching and is the core message of everything he will say later. To repent means to change one's mind, to completely change one's attitude from self-centeredness to God-centeredness. It suggests a total change in one's life. We see an example of this in Jesus' call to his first followers and their response. Simon and Andrew set aside what has been their life's work to follow Jesus. Their immediate response to accept Jesus' call testifies to their recognizing him as their leader. James and John, too, abandon work and father to follow Jesus. Believing in the gospel means a personal attachment to the person of Jesus and going with him on his way.

Life Focus: * Relate an experience when you were drawn to someone and it changed your life. * Describe a change in your life which resulted from another's call. * Name a time when you had a change of heart or mind.
