#### From the Pastor's Desk:

Today's first reading and Gospel set us thinking about where we get our information and whom we should believe. The Israelites traveling through the desert decided they had seen and hard enough directly from God. The noise

of his voice and the heat of his fire were too much for them to bear. So God agreed to raise up a prophet from among them and put his words into that prophet's mouth. All the people had to do was listen to those words and follow them. A fine plan, except that from the start there was a caveat - this human prophet might speak a message that was not form God.

The Gospel passage from Mark offers some irony: Jesus spoke with such authority that people were spellbound by his teaching and amazed by the results. Yet it was the unclean spirit in the possessed man who identified the true identity of Jesus, calling him "the Holy One of God." Did anyone else in the crowd know who Jesus was? Can we today identify a person who is speaking with God's authority versus someone speaking a message that is not from God?

#### From Deacon Don's Desk:

This past week we have been touched by those whom we have crossed paths with: Tom Burke, John Manlove, Jim Clinton. You may recall others and they leave an indelible mark in our own journey. May God in His merciful good-

ness embrace them in His care and include those who have not been given a chance to live due to abortion.

I want to introduce you to someone: He was born about, some say after 5 or 10 AD. His hometown was Tarsus the current territory of Turkey. Some considered him pompous, even cantankerous. He was considered highly intellectual even a genius. Tarsus was considered by some equal to a university town. He had the advantage of an education that crossed from Jewish to Gentile. He was considered a Pharisee. He probably was very adept at arguing scriptural passages and had access to such scholars as Gamaliel, considered the greatest Jewish teacher of the first century. He had the advantage of being born in a Roman territory that allowed him free travel. He was considered an "Adult Convert." It was three years before he met up with St. Peter and the Apostles. By now you know that we speak of St. Paul. We hope to introduce you to St. Paul as we journey through the last five months of this Year of St. Paul the Apostle to the Gentiles.

Our SCC challenge: Be aware and alert so as to be a positive influence to all people.

Our Prayer: God our Father, You taught the Gospel to all the world through the preaching of St. Paul Your Apostle. May we who celebrate during his year of remembrance, make his conversion to the faith our goal to continuing conversion of heart in bearing witness to Your truth. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The most important question Mark's Gospel asks is, "Who is Jesus?" Jesus speaks with authority, and people were stunned with the knowledge of the Scriptures Jesus displayed. Beyond this, his very presence changes situations. When he drives out the evil spirit, the crowd doesn't understand when the shrieking demon calls him by name - "the holy one of God." They discuss the power over evil and go out to spread the news throughout all of Galilee. But they keep asking, "Who is he?" For them and for us, it's more important to let the holy presence and authority of Jesus into the situations of our lives and of our world than to look for verbal answers and definitions of who Jesus is.

**Life Focus:** \* When has someone's presence brought change in your life? Was it negative or positive? \* Name an action you can take this week to give God greater influence in your life.
